BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That we hope a complete rest may bring to him a return of good health and usefulness.

The above resolution was adopted by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor Yett, Councilmen Haynes, Nolen and Searight, 4; nays, none, Councilman Avery absent.

Mayor Yett nominated Harris Bell as Judge of the Corporation Court. Nomination was confirmed by the following vote: Ayes, Councilman Haynes, Nolen and Searight, 3; nays, none, Councilman Avery absent, Mayor Yett present but not voting.

Councilman Searight moved that the City Attorney, J. Bouldin Rector, be instructed to demand payment by the Texas Bank & Trust Company of premium specified in its bid for the issue of City bonds of 1924. Motion prevailed by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor Yett, Councilmen Haynes, Nolen and Searight, 4; nays, none, Councilman Avery absent.

The Council then recessed.
