The Council was called to order by the Mayor. Roll call showed the following members present: Mayor Yett, Councilmen Avery, Haynes, Nolen, and Searight, 5; absent, none.

The Minutes of the last meeting were read and Councilman Haynes moved that same be adopted: Motion prevailed by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor Yett, Councilmen Avery, Haynes, Nolen, and Searight, 5; naves, none.

Fred C. Von Rosenberg, Attorney for John R. Lawrence and wife, appeared before the Council in reference to tax suit, No. 41380, City of Austin vs. John R. Lawrence, et al., now pending, and Councilman Haynes moved that the offer of a compromise be referred to J. Bouldin Rector, City Attorney, J. W. Maxwell, and F. C. Von Rosenberg, Attorneys, for their report back to the Council. Motion prevailed by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor Yett, Councilmen Avery, Haynes, Nolen, and Searight, 5; naves, none.
