Austin, Texas , January 31st 1916.

To the Hon A P Wooldrdidge, Mayor and City Council

of the City of Austin, Texas :

Gentlemen: On Friday January 21st 1916, there was filed in this office, a pertition signed by Citisens of the City of Austin, Texas, proposing an ordinance "for the purpose of properly regulating local street transportation of persons for hire by "Jitneys", autimobiles, motor busses and other motor vehicles ".

The said petition is signed by 1239 persons , claiming to be qualified voters of the City of Austin, Texas.

We have carefully compared the names appearing upon said petition with the Official Poll List of the City of Austin, Texas, furnished by Robt Maud , State and County Texas. Collector of Travis County, Texas, with the following result:

We find that said petition contains the names of 759 persons whose names appear upon the said Foll List, as qualified voters, 95 of whom have asked , iether personally , or by written communication , to have their names stricken from said list.

The remaining names, 480, we fail to find on the Official Poll List, including duplications.

Since making my reports of January 31st 1916, and February 2nd 1916, I have ,under your direction ,and assisted by the Gentlemen ,who checked the pesition ,as ordered by your Honorable Body ,again checked the said petition, and find 37 additional names on it who are qualified voters.

In justice to the Clerk, and the Gentlemen who assisted me in checking this pertition, I think it preper to say, that nearly all of these names were found in a different ward from the place given by them in signing the petition, or by error made by the Tax Collector who made the Poll List.

Since re- checking this list I have had filed with me 65 additional Postal Card requests , to have their names stricken from these petitions .

I have not had the time to check over these cards , to see whether or not, they have been checked as qualified voters .

ewners concerning the said hearing:

Whereas, the City Council of the City of Austin has heretefore determined to improve East 1st street from the east property line of Congress Avenue to the east property line of East Avenue in the City of Austin he acceptance. concrete foundation with concrete gutters along ourb lines and necessary excavation, and has adopted specifications for said work and has entered into a contract for the same with the Texas Bitulithic Cempany ,a Corperation; and

> Whereas, the City Engineer of the City of Austin has this day filed his report in writing with the City Council, showing the total cost of the said improvements upon the sais street , the amount per front feet of abutting property to be paid for by the embers thereof and also the names of persons, os tates or Corporations owning proprety abutting on said improvements with a description of their property and a statement of the total amount payable by each of said ewners for said improvements; and

> Whoreas, the City Council has examined the said report and finds the same correct; and

> Whereas, the necessity exists that a portion of the cost of said improvements should be assessed against said property ewners and their property, subject to the terms of the Charter of the City and the ordinance in such cases made and previded, and after the notice and hearing provided by said Charter and ordinance; New . Therefore,

Berit resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin, Texas :

- 1. That the said report of the City Engineer be, and the same is hereby approved and adepted.

That a portion of the cost of making said improvements shall be assessed against said owners of preperty abutting on east 1st street in the City of Austin between its intersect -tion with the east line of Congress Avenue and its intersection with the east line of East Avenue , and against the said preperty; that the said assessment shall be made at the ra rate of \$.3xessminxinentxinentxinentxinentxinentxixxxx \$ 4.871 per front foot of such property between Congress Avenue and Brazes street .and at the rate of \$ 3.835per front foot of such preperty between Bra ses street and East Avenue in accordance with the #Front foot" rule or plan in proportion as the frontage of each owner in each block of said street is to the whole Frentagein that block to be improved, provided that if said rule of apportion--ment shall appear to the City Council to be unjust or unequal in any particular case to result in an assessment in excess of the benefits received through said improvements by any owner or his property , the City Council shall adopt such rule of apportionment as shall effect substantial equality and justice between said property owners , considering benefits received by and burdens imposed upon said owners , and that in ne event shall any assessment be made in excess of the actual benefits received by the owners of said propertythrough the onhanoed value thereof by means of said imrovement .
- That a hearing shall be given before the Council to said property owners on the 17th day of FebrusryA D 1916 , at 10 0 clock A M , at the Mayer's office in the City Hall in the City of Austin, Texas, at which hearing sai property owners, their agents or Attorneys shall be fully and fairly heard as to all matters concerning the said improvement or any irregularity or invalidity in the proceedings with reference thereto,or as to the benefits thereof, if any, to their property, and as to the assessment proposedto be made

against them and their preperty, and as to any othermatter or thing connected therewith .At which hearing the said owners shall have the right to produce witnesses and testimeny , and which hearing shall be adjourned from time to time and from day to day until all are fully heard and all matters in connection with the sais improvements and assessment fully ascertained; that after the said hearing shall be closed , said City Council will preceed to assessagainst ewners of property upon said street and their preperty, who shall agree with said Council upon the said assessments , such sums as may be so agreed uponand determined by the Charter of the City and the said ordinance; and that as to any such preperty ewners who may not so agree, the City Council will, after said hearing, appoint a commission to determine said assessments , and will take such further steps in ascertainment thereof as are provided by the Charter and ordinance.

4. That the Supt of Streets and Public Improvements of the City of Austa is hereby directed to give notice hereof to the said property owners, their agents and attorneys by publication of a copy of this resolution not less than twice in the Austin Statesman, a daily paper of general circulation in the City of Austin, the first publication to be not less than five days prior to the date of hearing.
