

Regular meeting of the City Council: Austin, Texas, June 9th 1910.

The Council was called to order by the Mayor: Roll called:

Present Mayor Woolbridge, Councilmen Bartholomew, Gracy, Hart & Powell 5

Absent none.

The minutes were read and approved; Petitions, Memorials, etc :

Petition of Mrs M. S. Sampson to change sidewalk

By Councilman Powell petition of Mrs M S Sampson, asking permission to change sidewalk on south side of property west 10th & Rio Grande streets, which was read and laid over for further investigation.

Reports of City Officers:

Reports by officers

The Mayor laid before the Council the reports of the Sexton, the Assessor and Collector, The Matron of the Hospital, The Health Officer & Assistant, & the Marshal, which were read and ordered filed.

Unfinished business:

Fire Marshal ordinance passed

The Mayor laid before the Council an ordinance creating the office of Fire Marshal, prescribing the duties thereof, etc, which was read the third time and passed by the following vote:

June 9th 1910, 3 P M

The Council was called to order by the Mayor with all members present

Petition of T C Gregory et al Topul in RR station

The Mayor laid before the Council the petition of T C Gregory et al, asking permission to put in a spur R R track on East 4th street, together with the opinion of the City Attorney on the petition.

On motion the City Attorney was directed to prepare a submit to the Council an ordinance covering the case.

Mayor Woolbridge offered the following resolution, viz:

Resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin :

(1) That the property owners on east ninth street between Brazos and Trinity streets be invited by the Superintendent of streets and Public Improvements to meet with the City Council at its next regular meeting on June 16th, at 10 A M, for the purpose of a conference as to the necessity and importance, at this time, of curbing and sidewalking east ninth street from Brazos to Trinity streets.

(2) That the City Engineer be instructed to notify the property owners interested, as to the time, place and purpose of this proposed meeting.

The resolution was passed by the following vote :

Mayor Woolbridge offered the following resolution,:

Resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin :

Section 1. That all sidewalks on Congress Avenue from first to 11th street inclusive, and all sidewalks on sixth street from East to West Avenues, not already, in the judgement of the Superintendent of Streets and Public Improvements, sufficiently and properly constructed be and said sidewalks are hereby directed and ordered to be

brought to a proper grade, curbed and paved with concrete, in accordance with the provisions of the ordinances of the City of Austin in this behalf made and provided

Section 2. That the Superintendent of Streets and Public Improvements be and he is hereby authorized and directed to carry out the provisions of this resolution

Sidewalks east 9th street

Sidewalks Congress Avenue

in accordance with the ordinances of the City of Austin, providing for the construction, reconstruction and repair of sidewalks.

The resolution was adopted by the following vote :

Yeas Mayor Wooldridge, Councilmen Bartholomew, Gracy, Hart & Powell 5

Nays none.

On motion the Council recessed subject to call of the Mayor.

June 15th 1910.

The Council was called to order by the Mayor, with all members present except Councilman Powell, absent sick.

The Mayor laid before the Council the following resolution, viz:

Resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin:

That leave of absence be and is hereby granted to E C Bartholomew for thirty (30) days, or so much thereof as he may desire to use, from June 16th to July 16th, 1910.

The resolution was adopted by the following vote :

Yeas Mayor Wooldridge Councilmen Gracy, & Hart 3

Not voting Councilman Bartholomew 1

The Mayor laid before the Council the following resolution, viz:

Resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin :

That leave of absence is hereby granted Councilman Powell for thirty days (30) , or so much thereof as he may desire to use, from June 20th to July 20th, 1910.

The resolution was adopted by the following vote:

Yeas Mayor Wooldridge, Councilmen Bartholomew, Gracy & Hart 4

Nays none.

By Councilman Bartholomew an ordinance appropriating the sum of \$ 10,000.00 for the purpose of purchasing Poles, Wire, Transformers and other material .

The ordinance was read the first time and the rule suspended and it placed on its second reading by the following vote :

Yeas Mayor Wooldridge, Councilmen Bartholomew, Gracy, & Hart 4

Nays none.

The ordinance was read the second time and laid over.

By Councilman Gracy an ordinance appropriating the sum of \$ 30,000.00 for the purpose of paying the interest due July 1st 1910, on \$ 1,500,000.00 Refunding bonds of the City of Austin, Texas.

The ordinance was read the first time and the rule suspended and it placed on its second reading by the following vote:
