The Council was called to order by the Mayor:

Petition Bond Smith
for building permit

The Mayor laid before the Council a petition from Bond Smith, asking permission to erect a shade, within the fire limits, which was approved by the Board of Fire Commissioners & Councilman Kent.

Mayor Woodrige offered the following resolution:
Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin:

Resolution to grant
W. B. Riddle a
Wagon Scale 20' x 8'
East Avenue

That W. B. Riddle be and he is hereby authorized and
granted the right to erect and maintain one (1) iron
standard scale, at a point near the corner of 5th Street and
East Avenue in the City of Austin, Texas;
W. B. Riddle shall place said scale 12 feet and 6 inches from the property line,
fronting on said street, and 2 feet east from the division of
the east property line of East Avenue in East 5th Street,
said scale to be 22 feet by 8 feet in dimensions, provided that
said Riddle shall place said street, where said scale shall be
erected, in good and passable condition after the erection thereof,
and shall keep and maintain said street in such condition;
provided further, that said scale shall be for public and private use;
provided further, that the right herein granted may be rescinded
at any time by the City Council, and said Riddle may be
required to remove said scale from said street at his own cost;
provided further, that said Riddle shall hold the City harmless from
any and all damages to persons or property on account of the
erection and maintenance of said scale.

From R. R. track E. C.
Gregory et al.

The resolution was read the first time, and laid over,
by Mayor Woodruff an ordinance to grant to Tom P.
Gregory, Dr. Weaver, Joe Ravacchi, George Haywood, Austin
Gas Light Company, Houston Tanning Company, H. A. Deussen,
San Antonio Brewery Association, and Southern Bedding
Manufacturing Company, the right to construct, maintain, and
operate a railroad track upon and across certain streets in the
City of Austin, subject to certain conditions and penalties.

Grades to be fixed
for Congress Avenue to
Alley on West of same

The ordinance was read the first time and laid over.
Mayor Woodruff offered the following resolution:
Resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin,
That the following named grades be and are hereby established on
the driving in the North side of 7th Street from Congress
Avenue to Alley west of same, grades being taken on the west
fire plug at Northeast corner of 7th and Congress ave.
Assumed elevation 100':

At Alley	103.6
35' east of Alley	102.8
55' " "	100.5

From Avenue to Congress Avenue grade to be uniform,
Grade at Congress Avenue to be practically the same as at
present, except that it may be slightly lowered if
practicable in order to reduce height of steps on sidewalk
at the corner.

The resolution was passed by the following vote:
