the plant.

that this bond was never filed with the City.
If it should meet with your approval, I will notify the
present holders of this franchise, that they must comply
with the above requirement.

The Council was called to order by the Mayor with all
Members present.

Mayor Woodrige offered the following resolution:
Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin:

That Five hundred and seventy nine & 80/100 dollars (\$579.80) be
and the same is hereby appropriated out of the General fund
of the City of Austin for the purpose of purchasing and paying for
a street sixty (60) feet wide, out of Out Lot 3, Division "D",
City of Austin, more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the south line of Out Lot No 3,
Division "D" 276 feet from its SW Corner, thence parallel with
the west line of said Out Lot, Northerly, 310 feet to a point in
the North line of said Out Lot 276 feet from its NW Corner,
thence with said North line, Easterly, 60 feet to a point in said
thence parallel with the west line of said Out Lot southerly 310
feet to a point in the south line of said Out Lot, thence with
said south line, westerly, 60 feet to the place of beginning.

The resolution was read the first time and the rule suspended
and it placed on its second reading by the following Vote:
