Sidewalks, 10th & 11th streets

Councilman Powell offered the following resolution: Inasmuch, as in the judgment of the City Council, parts of first, second, ninth and tenth streets, in this City, are at the present time more residential than actively business streets, therefore,

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin: That, the owners of lots from the Alley East of Congress Avenue to Brazos street, and from the Alley West of Congress Avenue to Colorado street, on first, second, West ninth and tenth streets in this City, shall have the option of constructing the cement walk upon the sidewalk abutting upon their several lots of the standard width for residence streets of four and one half (4 1/2) feet, instead of the full width of the sidewalk, as has been heretofore, by ordinance prescribed

The resolution was adopted by the following vote: Yeas Mayor Woodrige, Councilmen Bartholomew, Gray, Hart & Powell

Awarded Contract for

The Council was called to order by the Mayor with all members present, except Councilman Powell. Councilman Hart presented bid of W. W. Graham Son for prescriptions for paupers for the year beginning July 1st 1910, which being the lowest bid offered and being satisfactory, the same was received and the contract awarded them by the following vote:

Councilman Gray presented the following communications:

Gentlemen:

Complying with your request of recent date, I have run the lines of Red River Street in the City of Austin, as now located, in Division C west of Outlots 20, 21, 22, 23 & 24 and east of Outlots 18, 10, 9, 6, 5 and 4.

Beginning at a stake said to be the N. E. Corner of Outlot 18, the east line of outlots 10 and 18 runs S 2° 20' W 478 feet to a stone said to be the south east corner of Outlot 10. The fence along this line does not follow the line joining the two points taken, but swings backward until it is seven feet back from said line at a point near its middle, from which it swings back to the line at the rock said to be the S. E. Corner of Outlot 10. Eastward, and directly across the street from these outlets is Mrs. Jordan's "Pleasure Heights" subdivision of Outlots 20 and 21 the west line of which is neither straight nor parallel with the above described line of Outlots 10 and 18, but seems to have been run straight from a point 20 feet approximately S 60° E. from the rock at the S. E. Corner of Outlot 10 to the extreme west end in the skirt of the fence about midway between this starting point and the N. W. Corner of Outlot 12. From this point the line begins to follow the fence to the N. W. Corner of the fence on Outlot 12.

The pipe in the NW Corner of Out Lot 20 is 52 $\frac{7}{10}$ from the line between the two Corners of Out Lots 13 and 10, and 53 $\frac{1}{10}$ from the fence line along the east side of Out Lot 13. The pipe for the SW Corner of Lot 12 is 53 $\frac{1}{10}$ feet from the straight line and 59 feet from the fence line on the east side of Out Lot 13. The offset in the fence on lot 7 is 55 $\frac{1}{10}$ from the straight line and 52 $\frac{1}{10}$ from the fence line on the east line of Out Lots 10 and 13, at this point the fence offsets 10 feet eastward. At the NW Corner of Lot 6 the pipe is 57 $\frac{1}{10}$ feet from the straight line, and the fence at this point is 12 feet farther east. At the SW Corner the pipe is 60 $\frac{1}{10}$ feet from the straight line, the distance between the fence lines here is 73 $\frac{1}{10}$ feet. These distances and conditions are shown on the accompanying Map, black lines and figures show the lines as claimed and the distances between same, green lines and figures show fence lines and distances between them, the red line shows the location of the west line of Plainview Heights if same is located 60 feet from the east line of the Country Club.

From the rock at the southeast Corner of Out Lot 10 the east line of the Beausite Addition bears S 39° 14' $\frac{1}{2}$ W 2042 $\frac{1}{10}$ feet in all to a pipe for the E Corner of Out Lot 6. This line is exactly on the fence line. The fence on the east side of the street varies from 64 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet to 73 feet east from this line, as shown in green on the Map.

From the pipe from the S.E. Corner of Out Lot 6 the west line of the street runs S 29° 30' $\frac{1}{2}$ W 60 feet to a pipe for the N.E. Corner of Out Lot 5, and continues 997 feet farther to a pipe set at the fence of Corner of the "Wellborn" Tract for the S.E. Corner of Out Lot 5. Across the street from Out Lot 5, Out Lot 23 is unfenced, so the lines claimed are indefinite.

This brings us to the North line of the "Christian Wellman" Addition from which line Red River Street is laid out 80 feet wide to 19th Street. From the southeast Corner of Out Lot 6 to the southeast Corner of Out Lot 10 the street is laid out entirely different from what is shown on the Land Office Map, it being now a straight line between the two points, while the Land Office Map shows two angles between these two points. This street is platted on the Land Office map 80 feet wide to the North line of the Original Union Tract, almost half a mile beyond the present city limits line.

To the Hon. Mayor and City Council

of the City of Austin.

Gentlemen,
 We have examined the report of Mr. M. C. Tolborn hereto attached and recommend that Red River Street between the Addition known as Plainview Heights, which is a subdivision of out lot 20 and a part of Out lot 21, Division "E" on the east, and Out lots 9, 10 + 13, Division "E", on the west, be established as a street 60 feet wide. The west line of said street to commence at a stake claimed to be at the N.E. corner of Out lot 13, Division "E" and to run S. 12° 20' W To a rock claimed to be the N.E. corner of Out lot 10, Division "E", thence S 38° 14' W To a point opposite the S.W. corner of said Plainview Heights Addition, and that the east line of Red River Street be 60 feet from said west line as above established. This is in accordance with the resolution passed by the Council July 1910.
