

August 3rd 1910

The Council was called to order by the Mayor with all members present, except Councilman Hart.

Councilman Bartholomew offered the following resolution:

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin, Texas: That the ~~Superintendent~~ Superintendent of Parks and Public Property is hereby authorized and instructed to pay a bill to the General Electric Company in the amount of Forty Nine & 17/100 dollars, (\$49.17) dated January 28th 1907.

The resolution was adopted by the following vote: Yeas Mayor Woodrige, Councilmen Bartholomew, Gray and Powell Nay None.

Mayor Woodrige laid before the Council the following resolution:

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin, Texas: That the City Council of the City of Austin, Texas, hereby recognizes East First Street from East Overmount to the City Limits, on the East, to be a street of the uniform width of sixty feet (60').

The resolution was adopted by the following vote: Yeas Mayor Woodrige, Councilmen Bartholomew, Gray & Powell Nay None.

Councilman Bartholomew moved that if five hydrants, instead of 3, be placed on 6' pipe now being laid between 3rd and 7th streets in Hyde Park.

The motion was adopted by the following vote: Yeas Mayor Woodrige, Councilmen Bartholomew, Gray and Powell Nay None.

Councilman Powell from whom was referred the petition of Art Yarrington for permission to change steps on driveway leading to the 2nd floor of his building presented the following report:

Austin, Texas, Aug 3rd 1910

To the Hon Mayor and City Council, City of Austin, Texas, Gentlemen:

In reference to the petition of Mr. Art Yarrington asking the privilege to change his steps on the outside of his building at No 325 East Sixth Street.

I recommend that he be granted a permit to change his steps at the side of his building on Prinity Street as he requests, provided that the steps do not take up any more of the sidewalk than they now do, and that he be held responsible for damages of any kind caused by the construction or the steps remaining on the sidewalk after completion, and if said steps at any time should be ordered to be moved

Sub Streets of Pub. Law

Councilman Powell offered the following resolution:
Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin, Texas,
That permission is hereby granted Ad Yarrington to erect
and maintain a wooden staircase from the sidewalk on the
second story of his premises situated at 325 East Sixth
Street, north of Sixth Street in the City of Austin, Texas, and
being intended to be a staircase facing northwardly, in place of the
staircase which faces southwardly, at the present time on said
premises.

Said permit is granted to said Ad Yarrington to
construct and maintain said staircase conditional upon
he hold the City harmless against any damage which
may result from the construction of the same, and further
that he shall remove said staircase, at his own expense,
at any time when so directed by the City Council.

Permission to erect and maintain said staircase, as
above described, is granted upon condition that the staircase
at the present time adjacent to said premises and facing
southwardly, shall be removed when the staircase hereinafter
authorized, shall be constructed.
