 an Ordinance entitled an ordinance providing for the
 exposing and sale and for the sale of pure food stuffs within the
 City of Austin, providing for the issuance of permits for
 the sale of dairy products; providing for the issuance of
 permits for the sale of meats, fish and fowls; providing for
 the issuance of permits for the sale of fruits, vegetables
 and other foods; for the inspection and regulation of hotels,
 restaurants and boarding houses; providing for the promulgation
 of rules for the better health of the City of Austin; and
 providing penalties for the violation of such rules, and the
 provisions of this ordinance.

Street lines
 Generally

The Mayor laid before the Council an ordinance to
 establish the correct location of the streets and other public places
 of the City of Austin, Tex., and to revision with the approval of the
 City Council the same, and also the permanent grades of the
 streets of the City of Austin, Texas.

The Commission was read the third amended Decree in

Sir-

Gentlemen:

Complying with your instructions, I have made a survey of Perdonales Street
from Sixth Street, South to the Colorado River. I have made ^{and} attach hereto a sketch, showing
data obtained. You will notice on this sketch a dotted line running up Perdonales Street
throughout its entire length. This is an arbitrary line taken half way between the East lines of
Quilts 38 ^{and} 24 ^{and} the West lines of Quilts 29 ^{and} 26 ^{and} at right angles to the established
center line of East First Street, ^{and} from this arbitrary line distances to fences ^{and} stakes
on each side of Perdonales Street are referred. The following is a summary of these distances
^{and} width of Perdonales Street:

At the North line of Sixth Street, fence on West side 38 7/10 feet from line, stake on East
21 7/10 feet from line, total width of Street 59 7/10 feet.

At the South line of Sixth Street is a fence corner 28 7/10 feet West, ^{and} nothing on the East.

At the North line of Fifth Street the fence on the West is 28 7/10 feet from the line ^{and} nothing on the East.

At the South line of Fifth Street the fence on the West is 26 7/10 feet, ^{and} the one on the East 42 7/10 feet
from the line making the total width of the Street 69 7/10 feet.

At the line between Quilts 10 ^{and} 26 on the West ^{and} 11 ^{and} 27 on the East, the West fence line
is 24 7/10 feet ^{and} the East fence line is 37 7/10 feet from the line, making the total width of the Street 61 7/10 feet.

At the North line of First Street, the fence corner on the West is 20 7/10 feet, ^{and} that on the
East 29 7/10 feet from the line, making the total width of the Street 49 7/10 feet.

At the South line of First Street, the fence on the West is 17 7/10 feet ^{and} the stake on the
East is 30 7/10 feet from the line, leaving the Street 50 7/10 feet width.

At the line between Quilts 40 ^{and} 52 on the West ^{and} Quilts 41 ^{and} 53 on the East,
the West fence is 17 7/10 feet, ^{and} the fence on the East is 36 7/10 feet from the line, making the total
width of Street 53 7/10 feet.

At the River bank the fence on the West is 14 7/10 feet ^{and} the fence on the East is 47 7/10
feet from the line, leaving the Street at this point 61 7/10 feet wide.

There is a fence ^{and} stake at the North line of Sixth Street, a stake at the North West
corner of Quilt 41, a fence at the line between Quilts 11 ^{and} 27, ^{and} a fence on the West
line of Quilt 53 on the River bank. ^{and} with these stakes ^{and} fences there is no straight
line that will even approximately agree.

You will also note on Quilt 41, the North line according to the Revised Map
of the R. & C. Undertaking should be 648 feet at measure 645 feet. Also, the West line
should be, according to same map 675 feet at measure 677 7/10 feet. Now these stakes
^{and} fences were either set wrong by the R. & C. Co. Company's surveyor, or noted wrong
on their recorded plat. ^{and} as the plat is a new one, having been filed for record
less than a year ago, it seems to me that it would be in order to call on that Company
to furnish us with a corrected plat of the Addition.

Lines Perdonales
Street

Under the circumstances "it is crossed map of the entire portions of the city below Fifth Street is made, I do not see any way of intelligently determining on the lines of these North and South Streets, and for this reason I cannot now recommend any line for Redwood Street

In establishing the grade for raising the H. O. C. R. R. tracks, I recommend the following grades for East 4th Street: the elevation ^{being} referred to the new iron plug South East corner 4th St. & Congress Ave. (assumed elevation 100 ft.)

- The top of the new iron plug at the South East corner of Fourth St. & Congress Avenue hereby fixed as of the assumed elevation of 100 feet
- The East property line of Congress Avenue, relative to said initial point (East property line of Congress Avenue at edge of paving) is hereby fixed at 97.9 feet
- The center of Brazos Street is fixed at 96.3 feet.
- The center of San Jacinto Street is fixed at 95.5 feet.
- The center of Trinity Street is fixed at 91 feet.
- The center of Archer Street is fixed at 86.5 feet.
- The center of Red River Street is fixed at 82 feet.

All of said elevations as here above given are fixed with relation to the initial point of 100 feet as first stated in this resolution.

initial point of 100 feet as first stated in this resolution.
