His is particularly noted in many places in the dangerous premimity of the wires of said companies to the light and power wires of the City and the lack of proper safeguards to prevent the possibility of contact with such wires. The City of Austin has recently been called to answer in a number of damage suits , which in my epinion were chargeable to other causes than the negligance of the City, and in every instance the injuries were alleged to have been inflicted by charges of catricity conducted ever the wires of a telephone company.

I would most respectfully urge on your HemerableBedy that you error immediately a therough survey of the entire everhead system of wiring existing in the City, to the end that you may be properly advised of the true conditions and take such steps for the protection of life and property as to you may seem best.

Under a previous approval we gavealline and grade for curbing and sidewalk in front of the Cabiness property on the north side of second street between Congress Avenue and Brazos street, making the grade correspond with the authorized grade of the center of the street.
