Gentlemen :

We have been asked to give a curb line on the north side of 20th street from Wichits atreet east, and on the east side of Wichits street from 20th street morth .

There is already a good surbing on the same side of 20th street in the block immediately west of the above location ,liming up for the entire block. This surbing is  $6_{0.55}$  ' from the center line of 20th street at the east side of Unversity Avenue, and 14.6'at the west side of Wichits spect. As 20th street is a 70' street, the distance from the center line accor--ding to the ordinance should be 17.5'.

I recommend that we put the new surbing in paralle to the center line and 17.5 ' therefrom This will make an effect of 2.9' between the east and west sides of Wighita street .

The surbing mentioned above was evidently put in with the idea of making the readway 30' instead of 35'. The only way to avoid the offset would be to place the surbing 14.\_5' from the benter line, and parallel therete,

regarding the readway as 30' instead of 35'. If curbings on the opposite side of the street were placed 15 ' from the conter line, the actual width of readway would then be 29.4' in this block. There would be, however, an angle in the morth curb at Wichsta street.

There is also a surbing , laid in the last two or three years , on the west side of Wichits streetfrom 20th street morth, lined with conters placed at 20th ans 21ststreets, and placed 15' therefrom. I recommend that we sum the Curburpon the east side of Wichits street paralliel with the above line, and the correct distance from the center,10,15 '.

> I also recommend that the grade of both curbings be placed on the approximate grade of the streets.


