Councilman Bartholemew offered the following resolution:
Resolved that the Supt of Parks and Public Property be authorized to contract
for a seven barbed wire fence on the North, East and South sides of
Oakwood Cemetery, said fence to consist of stripped cedar posts 7 feet in
length, with three inch tops, set 2 feet in the ground, for the price of 20 cents
for each post properly set.
Resolved that he ^{also} be authorized to purchase the necessary wire and staples and
to secure the necessary labor to complete said fence.
