

SPECIAL MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL: Austin, Texas, May 8, 1918.

The Council met with all members present.

The Mayor laid before the Council the application of Sam Cohen, 803 East Sixth street; for junk dealer's license, which was granted by a vote of 5 yeas, no nays.

The Mayor offered the following resolution:

Whereas, from the attached affidavit of Arthur E. Johnson, it appears that \$1,050.00 of the value of the improvements now being upon the property of his mother, Mrs. Axelina Johnson, on the south one-half of Block No. 1, Outlet No. 42, Division "B", of the City of Austin, Texas, represents improvements erected thereon subsequent to the 1st day of January, 1917,

Now, therefore,

RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN, TEXAS:

That the assessment against the said Mrs. Axelina Johnson for the improvements being upon the south one-half of Block No. 1, Outlet No. 42, Division "B", of the City of Austin, Texas, be reduced for the year 1917 from \$1,400.00 to \$350.00.

The resolution was adopted by the following vote: Yeas-- Mayor Wooldridge, Councilmen Anthony, Bartholomew, Haynes, and Powell, 5; nays none.

APPROVED, May 8, 1918: A. P. Wooldridge, Mayor.

The Mayor offered the following resolution:

RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

That the application of Carl Belisch for the refund of \$3.00 paid by him for Dog Tag No. 830--as set forth in the attached communication--be and the same is hereby declined.

The resolution was adopted by the following vote: Yeas-- Mayor Wooldridge, Councilmen Anthony, Bartholomew, and Haynes, 4; nays--Councilman Powell, 1.

The Council then adjourned.
