SPECIAL MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL: Austin, Texas, March 5, 1918.

The Council was called to order by the Mayor: All members present.

Col. Thomas Moore was present, and presented, verbally and in written documents, a request for an allowance of \$100.00 for a re-survey of Pease Park which he said had been made by him in the year 1913 as an incident to certain surveying which he did for the Pease estate. Definite action on the claim was deferred to a later time.

W. L. Eyres, Assistant Superintendent of the Water, Light and Power Department, and W. P. Johnson, chief engineer at the power plant, were present and discussed the necessity for additional pumping equipment in order to forestall a summer shortage of water, and also as a measure of precaution against a breakdown of the existing machinery.

Councilman Bartholomew offered the following Resolution:
RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN, TEXAS:

That the Superintendent of the Water, Light and Power Department of this city be and he is hereby authorized to invite bids for the sale to the City of Austin, Texas, of two 6-million gallon centrifugal pumps for use by the Water, Light and Power Plant of this city. Said bids are to be in writing and delivered to the Superintendent of the Water, Light and Power Department of this city prior to 12:00 M. of Tuesday, March 19, 1918.
