The Council was called to order by the Mayor: with all members present except Councilman Bartholomew.

Councilman Hart offered the following resolution:

Resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin:

That the Fire Dept of the City of Austin be and is hereby authorized to ship to H W Merrill general manager of the Underwriters Laboratories 27 E Ohio street, Chicago Illinois for the purpose of testing, 2 sections of fire hose 50 feet each, with couplings, new in use by the fire dept, one section of the Empire brand and one of the Titan brand the shipment and return of said hose to be at the expense of the National Board of Fire Underwriters.

The resolution was adopted by the following vote :

The Mayor laid before the Council the following resolution :

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin :

(1) That the Budget proposed by the Mayor for this City for the year 1910, as set forth in his communication of the same to the City Council, dated April 1st, 1910. be and the same is hereby accepted and approved.

(2) That the appropriations recommended by the Mayor in said Budget be and the same are hereby made.

(3) That the City Clerk is hereby directed to enter to the Credit of said appropriations the amounts of the same, for the purposes and in the form set out in said Budget.

(4) That where appropriations are made for salaries, said salaries shall be payable monthly.

(5) That where appropriations made in said Budget are not used in whole or in part, the amount of said appropriation not used shall, at the expiration of the fiscal year, lapse into their appropriate funds or remain to the credit of the same.

The resolution was read the first time and the rule suspended and it placed on its second reading by the following vote:
