

Regular meeting of the City Council : Austin, Texas; April 28th 1910.

Hon A P Wooldridge, Mayor presiding : Roll called :

Present Mayor Wooldridge, Councilmen Bartholemew, Gracy, Hart & Dwell 5

Absent None.

The minutes of the last regular and recessed meetings were read and approved.

Petitions, Memorials, etc :

The Mayor laid before the Council the petition of the Tom C Gregory Co , et al asking permission to put in a spur track on East 4th street, which was read and referred to the City Attorney.

Councilman Hart presented a petition from The Lone Star Garage Co asking permission to put in a gasoline tank in front of their place of business on Colorado street, which was read and referred to Councilmen Hart & Powell for investigation and report.

Councilmen Hart & Powell to whom was referred the petition of the Lone Star Garage Co for permission to put in a gasoline tank at their place of business at 500 Colorado street, presented the following resolution:

Lone Star Garage Co to put in Gasoline Tank

Resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin:

That permission is hereby granted the Lone Star Garage to place a Lewis fireproof five(5) barrel gasoline storage tank under the sidewalk in front of 500 Colorado street in the City of Austin: said work to be done under the direction and supervision of the City Engineer and Board of Fire Commissioners; provided, that the applicant for such permit shall restore said sidewalk to its present condition , and shall pay all losses and damages that the City of Austin shall sustain on account of the placing and maintaining of such tank at such place; provided, further, that the City of Austin may at any time revoke and annul this permit and order the removal of said tank from said place

Section 1. That the following grades be and the same are hereby permanently and finally established for the center of street on ninth street between Colerado and Lavacca streets ,and on Colerado street between Ninth and tenth streets ,in the City of Austin:

- Center of intersection of 9th & Colerado streets 533.41
- Center of Colerado street at north property line of 9th street 533.60
- Center of Colerado street at south side of alley between ninth and tenth streets 535.11
- Center of Colerado street at north side of alley between ninth and tenth streets 535.60
- Center of Colerado street at south side of tenth street 541.70
- Center of Ninth street 220 feet west of center of Colerado at 542.66
- Center of Ninth street 270 feet west of center of Colerado St 543.91
- Center of Ninth street at east property line of Lavacca St 544.41

Section 2. That the above elevations refer to Sea Level as given by the Bench Marker the United States Geological Survey, at the Post Office Building at Sixth and Coler/ade streets, in the City of Austin.
