

Regular meeting of the City Council: Austin, Texas Nov 17th 1910.

The Council was called to order by the Mayor, with all members present :

The minutes of the last regular and recessed meetings were read and approved; Petitions, etc.

The Mayor laid before the Council a petition from Earl Smith, asking to have certain pound fees paid by him refunded. The petition was read.

Councilman Hart moved that the petition be NOT granted, which motion prevailed by the following vote :

Yeas Mayor Weeldridge, Councilmen Bartholemew, Gracy, Hart & Powell 5
Nays none.

Reports of City Officers :

The Mayor laid before the Council the report of the City Engineer and the Supt of the water and Light plant for the month of October, 1910, which were read and ordered filed .

The Mayor laid before the Council the following resolution :

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin :

That a cordial solicitation is hereby made to the Commercial Secretaries Association of the State of Texas, to make its permanent headquarters in the City of Austin, Texas. This Council believes that mutual advantage will accrue to this City and to the Commercial Secretaries Association, of the State of Texas, should said Association conclude to establish its permanent head quarters in this City .

The resolution was adopted by the following vote :

The Council then recessed subject to call of the Mayor.

November 18th 1910.

The Council was called to order by the Mayor with all members present .

The Mayor laid before the Council the following resolution :

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin :

That permission be and is hereby granted to the Shriners to suspend from the center trolley pole on Congress Avenue to the McKean Eilers & Co's building, a canvass sign of the dimension of twenty feet long by twenty inches wide, upon which will be inscribed "Welcome Shriners", "Headquarters Driskill Hotel". This sign is here permitted to be suspended at the place described above on the 20th, 21st and 22nd days of November, 1910.

The resolution was adopted by the following vote :

Yeas Mayor Weeldridge, Councilmen Bartholemew, Gracy, Hart & Powell 5
Nays none.

The Mayor laid before the Council, an ordinance regulating the use and improvement of natural drains and waterways in the City of Austin, etc.,

Councilman Bartholemew offered the following amendment "Strike out section 2k renumber the remaining sections to correspond with the ordinance", which amendment was adopted by the following vote :

Yeas Councilmen Bartholemew, Gracy & Hart 3 Nays Mayor Weeldridge & Councilman Powell

The ordinance was then passed by the following vote :

November July 19th 1910.
