

Regular meeting of the City Council : Austin, Texas, January 5th 1911.

The Council was called to order by the Mayor: Roll Called :

Present Mayor Woolridge, Councilmen Bartholomew, Gracy, Hart & Powell 5
Absent none.

The reading of the minutes was postponed until later.

By Councilman Hart Petition of H F Murray asking that he be allowed to pay over a fine assessed in the Recorder's court against one Young Johnson, amounting to \$ 19.40 to his Mother, the young man being dead and his Mother in indigent circumstances.

The petition was refused by the following vote:

Nays Mayor Woolridge, Councilmen Bartholomew, Gracy & Hart 4

The Mayor read a communication from the Parents and Teachers Clubs asking the Council to pass an ordinance prohibiting the sale of Toys, Candles, etc near the public Schools of the City, which was read and referred to the City Attorney for investigation and if thought advisable to bring in an ordinance on the subject by the following vote :

Bids for Meat for the City Hospital were rejected on account of informality.

The Council recessed subject to call of the Mayor.

Jan'y 6th 1911.

The Council was called to order by the Mayor with all members present.

Councilman Powell submitted bids from J O Pelhemus, A A Mundt & Ray McDonald for constructing a concrete Culvert over Little Shoal Creek on West 5th & Nueces streets, which were opened and read .

On motion of Councilman Powell the contract was awarded to Ray McDonald, he being the lowest bidder, by the following vote :

On motion of Councilman Powell the certified checks of Mr Pelhemus and Mr Mundt were ordered returned.

Austin, Jan'y 10th 1911.

The Council was called to order by the Mayor with all members present.

The Mayor laid before the Council the following resolution :

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin :

That Thirtyfour Thousand, Six hundred and twenty and 55/100 dollars

9 \$ 34,620.55). out of the proceeds of the sale of the first thirty-five thousand dollars (35,000.00 of the City of Austin , five per cent (5%) bonds , series of 1910, be paid over in bulk by the City Council to the School Board of the City of Austin, Texas.

Be it further resolved:

That the Mayor of this City is here authorized and instructed to draw his warrant for said thirty four thousand , six hundred , twenty and 55/100 dollars upon the City Treasurer against the School Bond fund . Said draft to be made payable to the Treasurer of the School Board, and for said warrant the Mayor is instructed to take the receipt of the Treasurer of the Austin School Board , to-wit: The American National Bank of Austin, Texas .

The resolution was adopted by the following vote :

The Council recessed subject to call of the Mayor.

January 11th 1911.

The Council was called to order by the Mayor with all members present:

Councilman Powell offered the following resolution :

Whereas, Out Lots 72 & 75 in Division "D" in the City of Austin , as shown on the Government map of said City on file in the General Land Office of the State of Texas, are shown to contain 40 acres each , and are bounded on the East by a street of the estimated width of 115 feet now called Guadalupe street, on the South by a street of the estimated width of 60 feet , now called West 29th street, on the West by the East line of the George W Spear League and on the North by a street of the estimated width of 60 feet, now called West 34th street., and

Whereas , no corners of said Out Lots are positively known to exist, and, Whereas , both Out Lots Nos 72 & 75 have been in part sub-divided by various persons , and corners established on the ground and improvements made according to said sub-divisions , and ,

Whereas, while said improvements do not conform strictly to said sub-divisions , it would entail a hardship on the owners of said improvements to have to remove same , and such removal would be of little benefit to the City of Austin , especially as the true lines of said sub-divisions cannot accurately be determined .

Now Therefore, Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin:

That the streets and alleys, as now laid out through and across said Out Lots Nos 72 & 75, and defined by fencing and improvements , be and the same are hereby confirmed and adopted as the streets and alleys in said Out Lots, subject however to such revision of the same as may hereafter be made by a court having jurisdiction in the matter .

A plat of said sub-divisions as now made being on file with the City
