The Council was called to order by the Mayor with all members present.

The Mayor laid before the council the following resolution :

Resolution ordering the improvement of portions of 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th and 10th streets,in the City of Austin, Texas ;

Approving specifications, proposals, contracts, and bonds therefor, and, appropriating funds therefor.

Wherewa, it is deemed necessary to improve the following streets of the City of Austin within the following limits to-wit:


5th street from Rast curb line of Colorado street to West curb line of Trinity street.

5th street -from West line of San Antonio street to East curb line of West Avenue.

7th street, from East ourb line of Colorado streetto to West ourb line of Brazos street.

Sth street from East line of Congress Avenue to West curb line of Bresos street.

9th street from East ourb line of Coloredo street to to West ourb line of Brazos street.



.19th street, from the East ourb line of Colorado street to West ourb line of Bragos street, and

Thereas, the City Engi neer of this City has this day filed with the City Council complete specifications for the performance of the said work, by paving the said streets with the Bitulithic paving upon the five inch gravel concrete foundation with concrete gutters along ourb lines eighten inches wide and necessary excavation; and,

Whereas, the Texas Bitulithic Company has filed with the City Council a proposal to do said work at and for the following prices, to-wit:

For earth and loose rock expavation ffor expavation solid rock

35cents per Cu yd \$ 3.00 per Cu yd

For Bitulitic paving including 5 inch gravel concrete foundation as specified and concrete gutters, with five years maintenance \$ 2.21pr sq yard.

And whereas, the City Attorney has prepared contracts for the said.

work, between the City and the Texas Bitulithic Co mpany and also bonds

for the contraction and maintenance thereof by the said company, with

the United States Fidelity and Susmantes Company as surety, and has sub
mitted the same to the City Council; therefore.

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin :

- (1) That the said streets be improved by paving the same with the bit-ulithic pavement within the limits above named with five inch gravel
 foundation, neccessary excavation, and concrete gutters, all as set forth
 in said specifications:
- (2) That the said specifications for said work prepared by the City Engineer be and the same are hereby adopted, and that the proposal of Texas Bitulitic Company to perform the said work be accepted and the said work let to that Company, and that the contracts prepared and submitted by the City Attorney for the performance of said work on each of the said streets, be and the same are hereby approved, and that the Mayor of the City of Austin is hereby directed upon the taking effect hereof, to execute said contracts on behalf of the City and in its name, and the City Clerk is directed to attest the same with the impress of the Corporation seal; that the form of construction and maintenance bond submitted , by the City Attorney for execution by said Texas Bitu-lithic Company, and the United States Fidelity and Quarantee Company be and the same is hereby approved as surety thereon, and that the same be accepted by the City of Austin upon execution by said pri noipel and surety.
- (3) That the cost of said improvements shall be paid as follows to-wit:
- (a) The City shall pay to the said contractor the whole cost of improving intersections of other streets and alleys with said streets named to be improved, except so much thereof as may be occupied by the rail rails and tracks of any, railroad company and tweelve inches on the outside of said rails, within which limits the cost of such improvements shall be born by said street railway company; and, such owners shall also

.bear and pay the cost of said improvements between and inside of their said rails and tracks and twelve inches on the outside thereof, pon other portions of said streets named to be paved in addition to said intersections;

(b) The remainder of the cost of said improvements shall be paid by the owners of property abutting thereon, and assessed against them and their property in accor-

-dance with the Charter and Ordinances of the City of Austin, provided, that no assems -ment shall be made against any owner or his property, in excess of the actual benefits to the said property in enhanced value by means of said improvement nor until after notice and hearing to said owner as provided by said Charter and ordinances; and all payments to said Bitulithic Copmany for the performance of said work shall be made in accordance with the said specifications hereby adopted.

- 4 That the sum of Eleven thousand dollars (\$11,000.) or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated and set apart from the Permanent Paving fund of the City of Austin, not heretofore appropriated, for the purpose of paying the portion of the cost of said improvements payable by the City of Austin under the terms hereof and that said sum hereby set apart is declared to be a special fund which shall not be drawn upon or diverted to any other purpose except the payment of the City's portion of the said cost.
- 5. That this resolution shall remain on file with the City Clerk for public inspection for one week before the final passage or adoption thereofand shall then be finally adopted.

The resolution was read the first time and the sule suspended and it placed on its second reading by the following vote:

Yeas Mayor Wooldridge, Councilmon Battholomen, Hart, Lockridge & Powell Sayds none.

The resolution was then read the second time and laid over.

If B. The above resolution was presented to the City Council, and action thereon had at a recessed meeting of the City Council, held on the 4th day of May A D 1911, but was not handed the Clerk until after the minutes of a later date had been entered, hence are entered after wards.
