

Regular meeting of the City Council: Austin, Texas, June 22nd 1911.

The Council was called to order by the Mayor; Roll called:

Present Mayor Wooldridge, Councilmen Bartholomew, Hart & Lockridge 4

Absent Councilman Powell- 1

The minutes of the last regular and subsequent recessed meetings were read and approved.

Found ordinance*

Councilman Powell entered the Council chamber.

By Councilman Hart an ordinance amending Article seven (7), Title two (2), Chapter two (2), of the Revised ordinances of the City of Austin, State of Texas, relating to the prevention of the running at large of certain live stock within the corporate limits of the City of Austin, within certain limits, and repealing the amendment to said article passed July 20th 1909, for the violation of which a penalty is provided.

The ordinance was read the first time and passed under suspension of the rules by the following vote :

Monday June 26th 1911-

The Council was called to order by the Mayor with all members present.

The Mayor laid before the Council the following resolution :

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin :

That the petition of Geo Southernwood, A W Griffith and Mrs Naomi McCleery, for a four feet concrete sidewalk in front of their several properties on the north side of sixth street between Tio Grande and West Avenue, be and the same is hereby declined.

The resolution was adopted by the following vote :

Nays none.

The Council then recessed subject to call of the Mayor.

Tuesday June 27th 1911.

The Council was called to order by the Mayor with all members present.

Councilman Hart offered the following resolution :

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin :

That the Officers and Patrolmen of the Police department be and they are each granted (10) tendays leave of absence, with pay, the time of absence from duty in each case to be fixed and regulated by the Chief of Police and the Superintendent of Police and Public Safety, so that a sufficient number of men are at all times on duty to preserve the peace, and the efficiency of the department may not be effected.

The resolution was adopted by the following vote :

Nays none.

Councilman Bartholomew offered the following resolution :

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Austin:

That a leave of absence be and is hereby granted to W A Alff, City Sexton, for the
