That the City Attorney be and is hereby instruceted to submit to the Council a draft or form of contract according to which said work can be contracted for and paid for in installments out of gross remaints from the City water, light and power plant, without violating limitations on the power of the City, if in his opinion the City can legally make such a contract, If in his opinion the City cannot legally make such a contract, he is instructed to so advise the Council in writing, stating the legal objections to a contract of the character mentioned. The resolution was read and laid on the table subject to call.
