

. Regular meeting of the City Council : Austin, Texas , July 13th 1911

The Council was called to order by the Mayor: Roll called:
Present Mayor Wooldridge, Councilmen Bartholomew, Hart, Lockridge & Powell
Absent none.

The minutes of the last regular and subsequent recorded meeting...

Petitions, etc:

By Councilman Hart ,petition from W Maufries, asking the Council to
remit the unpaid portion of a fine against one Tom Harris in the Recorder
Court, which was read and on motion the petition refused by the following
vote;

New Business :

By Councilman Hart ,an ordinance repealing Articles 1073 & 1075 of Title
39, Chapter 1, of the Revised ordinances of the City of Austin entitled
"Regulation of Theatres, Circuses, Public Halls and Public Dance Houses"
The ordinance was read the first time.

By Mayor Wooldridge an ordinance granting to the Missouri, Kansas and
Texas Railway Company of Texas the right and requiring said Company to
construct ,maintain and operate a railroad Switch track or turnout upon
and across certain streets in the City of Austin, subject to certain
conditions. The ordinance was read the first time and passed under
suspension of the rules by the following vote.:

Mayor Wooldridge offered the following resolution:

That permission be and is hereby granted to Rev J A Musa, Pastor of the Mexican Baptist Church of this City, to erect and maintain for use for religious purposes a cloth tent, capacity to seat four hundred persons, from July 17th to 27th inclusive, at and upon the southwest quarter of the City Park, situated between Guadalupe and San Antonio streets, and fourth and fifth streets of this City.
