

SPECIAL MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL: Austin, Texas, May 15, 1918.

The Council met with all members present.

Councilman Anthony submitted the resignation of Ed Smith as a foot patrolman, and the resignation was accepted by a vote of 5 yeas. Mr. Anthony then nominated C. M. Browne to be a foot patrolman. The nomination was confirmed by the following vote: Yeas-- Mayor Woolbridge, Councilmen ~~Anthony~~ Bartholomew, Haynes, and Powell. 4; nays none; Councilman Anthony not voting.

The Mayor laid before the Council the application of George Fiegel Jr., 606 Guadalupe street, for public service car license on a Model T Ford automobile, No. 233454. It was granted by a vote of 5 yeas.

Councilman Powell offered the following resolution:
RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN, TEXAS:

That the sum of Two Thousand, Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the General Street Fund of the City of Austin, Texas, for the purpose of tarviating State, or 34th, Street ^{from} where it intersects Guadalupe Street to the city limits.

The resolution was adopted by a vote of 5 yeas, no nays.

APPROVED, May 15, 1918: A. P. Woolbridge, Mayor.

Councilman Powell offered the following resolution:

Whereas, it was expected that the city's part of the cost of installing a sanitary sewer main from the nearest convenient point in the city to Camp Mabry would cost about \$10,000.00, which sum, to accomplish this enterprise, was transferred from the surplus earnings in the Water and Light Department to the Sanitary Sewer Fund; but

Whereas, not exceeding Seven Thousand Dollars (\$7,000.00) will represent the cost of the city's part of this sanitary sewer extension, thus leaving Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) in the Sanitary Sewer Fund subject to the action of the City Council; and

Whereas, one business enterprise in the city is often as important as another,

Now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN, TEXAS:

That the sum of Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) of the unexpended balance transferred to the Sanitary Sewer Fund for the purpose of a sanitary sewer extension to Camp Mabry be and the same is hereby transferred to the General Street Fund of the City of Austin, Texas, for the purpose of tarviating State Street from where it intersects Guadalupe Street to the city limits.

The resolution was adopted by the following vote: Yeas-- Mayor Woolbridge, Councilmen Anthony, Bartholomew, Haynes, and Powell, 5; nays none.

APPROVED, May 15, 1918: A. P. Woolbridge, Mayor.

The Council then adjourned.
