This appropriation is payable at the rate of not exceeding \$75.00 per month, beginning June 1st, 1918.

The resolution was adopted by a vote of 5 yeas, no nays.

That the sum of Three Thousand, Two Hundred Dollars (\$3,200.00) be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the Earnings Fund of the Water, Light and Power Department to pay for same.
