Walling presented a petition, signed by a majority of the property owners on East 11th Street from San Jacinto to Red River Streets, requesting that the City pave said street with permanent paving. Councilman Reed moved that the matter be referred to the City Manager, with the request that he see if funds can be made available at the present time for the City's proportionate part of this work. Motion was seconded by Councilman Steck, and same prevailed by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor McFadden, Councilmen Pannell, Reed, and Steck, 4; nays, Councilman Barker.
