The Layor stated that the meeting was oallod for the purpose of hearing the report of the Library dommiesion on the bids for the oonatmation of a publio library building fhich rere reoelved by the Council on the 28 th instant and referred to gaid dommision for a detailed study and reoommendation, and of awarding the contraota for aid building.

The Library Commianion then presented the following written report, whioh was read:

Mr. H. H. Luedecke, Ohairman of the Building Committee, reported to the Commiseion that the building Committee of the commiesion reoommends that the following bidders be referred with their approval to the oity Council for employment by the douncil:

1. Kr. Leadeoke moved, and it was unanimounly oorried, that the oommisalion reoommend the entise bid, baplo and alternaten, of $\mathrm{Kr} . \mathrm{H}, \mathrm{F}$. Fattinger, he boing the lowent bidder; and requeat the Council to let the general contraot to Mr. H. F. Mattinger at $8106,636.00$, asbjeot to additions or deduotions al per aiternates.
2. Mr. Luedeoke moved, and it was unanimorasy carried, that the Commigaion reoommend that Mr. John in. Martin be awarded the oontraot for plumbing and heating at \$8,747.00.
3. Mr. Luedeoke moved, and it was unanimougly oarried, that Fox-Bohmidt bo ararded the contraot for eleotrio wiring and fixtures at \$4,084.00.

The Oommasion therefore gubmits their recommendations to the oouncil, trusting that the Oounas Fill act favorably upon them.

The Mayor stated that before awarding the oontracts, the ooundil would hear those present Who deelred to be heard in the matter.

Fiward $I$. Lorey, of the $115 m$ of Sohwerzer \& Lorey, one of the bidders, was prosent, in a000xdanoe 7ith his previous request, and apoke at length upon the merits of Rockwood Alabama Limestone epeoified in an alternate bid, and urged the selection of same in preferenoe to Cordova Oream Limeatone, apeoified in the basio bid. Upon beine advised that it was not desirable to use Rookwood Alabama Limestone, kr. Lorey then urged the seleotion of onion oreek or Dry Oreek Limestone instead of Oordova Oream Limestone.
F. H. Iuedecke, Ohairmen of the Building Committee of the Library Commiseion, stated that the Commiseion, after a thorough study of all materials submitted, had recommended the seleotion of Cordova Oream Iimestone beoause of 1 ts adapability to the style of arohiteoture, 1 ts moderate price, and its being a home produot.

Following the disoussion, the Mayor introduced the followine resolution:

(3) That the bid of Fox-Sohmidt, for $\$ 4,084.00$, for eleotrio wiring and fixtures for the public library building, same being the lowest bid therefor, be and the same in hereby acoepted and the contract 1 a hereby let and aviarded to the aid fox-Schmidt for buch electric wiring and fixtures at said sum, and the oity Attorney is instruoted to prepare the contract In accordance witk said bid and tie plans and specifications tnerefor.

The above resolution vas adopted by the following vote: Ayes, Councilmen Alford, Gillis, Mayor MoFadden, Councilmen Mueller and Steck, 5; neys, none.
dhe Council then instructed the Library Comnission to consider further the different bids on windows, bookstacks, acoustic treatinent, screens and other items not inciuded in the basio bid and bring in their recommendations with reference to same.

Oounailman Mueller moved that the oounoil eive a vote of confidence in the ability and Intogrity of the Arohiteot, H. F. Kuehne. Yotion was seconded by Oounollman Alford and ame prevailed by the following vote: Ayes, Oounoilmen Alford, Gillis, Mayor Lhofadden, -Oounoilmen Mueller and Steok, 5; nays, none.

Architeot Kuehne then expressed his deep apprealation to the dounoil for their confldence and support and for boing allowed a part in seeing his long-oheriahed dream of a pub110 11brary for the 01ty materialize.

The Mayor also extended the thanks of the 0ity Council to the Library Commission for their earnest and painstaking offorts in the construotion of the ilbrary building.

Oounoilman Alford then moved to recess, subjoot to call of the Mayor. Motion was seoonded by Kayor MoFadden and same prevalled by the following vote: Ayos, oounolimen Alford G1111e, Mayor MoFadden, Counoilmen Kuelier and Steok, 5 ; nays, none.

The Oounoll then recessed.

The Minutes of the last meeting reze mead and Oounoilman alford moved the adoption of same as read. Kotion was seoonded by Oounoilman Mueller and same prevailed by the following vote: Ayes, Oouncilmen Alford, Gilils, Mayor Mosadden, Jounoilmen Mueiler and gteok, 5; nays, none.

Mr. F. O. Rather presented to the Counail thirteon petitions, aigmed by approximately aix mundred and fifty taxpayere and merohanta of the 0ity, proteating the out in the salaries and rages of oity employes for the yoar 2932.

Meaers. F. O. Rather, E. Ferria, Ohrif Dallan, Rabbi Bamuel H. Baron, Phililp Johngon, O. W. Moore, Dr. E. P. Sohoch, H. O. Oolley, Doputy Labor Commiesioner, and V. H. Panneli, apokesmen for a large delegation of oitizens presont, urged that the dounoil resoind ite former aotion in reduoing the aslarien and wages of oity omployes, pointing out the loss reariting to the business firms of the oity by a ourtailment of expenditures of oity employes, and the setting of a precedent for county and atate salary reductions.

Oouncilman Gillif presented a petition gignod by the merohants of south Austin, protesting againet any out in the salaries and wages of oity employes drawing leas than $\$ 150.00$ per month, and stated that he did so at the request of alach petitioners, but that he was not supporting euch petition.
A. C. Baidinin, Ohaiman of the Gub-committec on Oity Affaiza of the Travis County Texpayers League, was present and apoke in defenso of the lommittee's aotion in recommending a roduction in the salaries and wages of oity omployes.
