REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL:

Austin, Texas, April 16, 1931.

The Council was called to order by the Mayor. Roll call showed the following members present: Mayor McFadden, Councilmen Mueller, Pannell, Reed, and Steck, 5; absent, none.

The Minutes of the last meeting were read and Councilman Pannell moved the adoption of same as read. Motion was seconded by Councilman Mueller, and same prevailed by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor McFadden, Councilmen Mueller, Pannell, Reed and Steck, 5; nays, none.

Councilmen-elect Alford and Gillis were present at the invitation of the Council.

A committee of citizens from the Govalle School District were present and presented petitions signed by a majority of the resident qualified voters of said District asking that the corporate limits of the City of Austin be extended so as to include said District for school purposes only. E. A. Murchison, President of the Board of Trustees of the Austin Public Schools, was also present and submitted to the Council the following communication:

"Austin, Texas, April 14, 1931.

To the Honorable Mayor and City Council,
Austin, Texas.

Gentlemen:

The Board of Trustees of the Austin Public Schools passed the following resolution on April 13, 1931, by a unanimous vote:

'BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE AUSTIN PUBLIC SCHOOLS:

That we recommend that the corporate limits of the City of Austin be extended for school purposes only so as to embrace the Govalle Common School District No. 18, Travis County, Texas, as set out in the petition presented herewith'.

AN ORDINANCE EXTENDING THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN, TEXAS, FOR SCHOOL PURPOSES ONLY, TO INCLUDE THAT CERTAIN TERRITORY KNOWN AS GOVALLE COMMON SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 18, TRAVIS COUNTY, TEXAS, DESCRIBED IN THIS ORDINANCE, AND PROVIDING FOR THE ASSESSMENT AND COLLECTION OF SCHOOL TAXES WITHIN THE TERRITORY SO ADDED.

The ordinance was read the third time and Councilman Mueller moved that same be finally passed. Motion was seconded by Councilman Pannell, and same prevailed by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor McFadden, Councilmen Mueller, Pannell, Reed, and Steck, 5; nays, none.

The Mayor laid before the Council the following resolution:

WHEREAS, in 1927 an error was made by the Tax Department in transferring to the block books the valuation placed by the Unit System upon the north $\frac{1}{2}$ of Lots 1, 2, 3, and 4, Block 102, Plat 7, Original City, assessed in the name of Mrs. Mary M. Bell, placing the full valuation of same at \$6240.00 when it should have been \$4990.00; and

WHEREAS, this error has been corrected upon the books of the Tax Department as to future years, but it is only fair and equitable that the owner of the above property be entitled to a refund of the amount of excess taxes paid, by reason of said error, for the years 1927, 1928, 1929, and 1930, amounting to \$71.65;

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

That the thanks of the City Council is hereby extended to the Girls' Friendly Society for their most generous and much-needed contribution; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That this resolution be spread upon the Minutes of the City Council, and that a copy of same be sent to said organization.

The Mayor laid before the Council the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the City Engineer has made a study of the situation and prepared a map showing the recommended house numbers for said premises and said map has been considered by the City Council; therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

That the premises abutting both the east and west sides of South Congress Avenue from the south end of Congress Avenue Bridge across the Colorado River to the north line of Nellie Street be numbered in accordance with the recommended house numbers shown on the plat hereto attached, marked 2-B-217, which plat is hereby made a part of this resolution.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

That Texas Public Service Company be and the same is hereby permitted to lay and construct its gas mains in and upon the following streets:

A gas main in Neches Street from the north line of East Third Street to a point 24 feet south of the north line of East Fifth Street, the center line of which gas main shall be 33 feet east of and parallel to the center line of said Neches Street. Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than 2½ feet.

The Texas Public Service Company is hereby put upon notice that the City of Austin does not guarantee that the space assigned above is clear from other underground utilities, but is based upon the best records we have at hand, and that the minimum depth stated does not have any reference to the fact that greater depths may be required at special points. When the Texas Public Service Company requires definite information upon the ground as to elevations or working points from which to base the location of their assignments they shall apply to the City Engineering Department not less than three (3) days before such information is required. The Texas Public Service Company is further put upon notice that they will be required to bear the expense of repairs or replacement of any underground utility damaged during the construction of lines named in this resolution.

AND THAT wherever pavement is cut in the vicinity of a fire plug, water must be used at intervals during the course of back-filling of the ditches.

That the work and laying of said gas mains, including the excavation in the streets and the restoration and maintenance of said streets after said mains have been laid, shall be under the supervision and direction of the City Manager, and under all the pertinent terms and conditions of the certain franchise granted to said Company by the City of Austin.

That Texas Public Service Company be and the same is hereby permitted to lay and construct its gas mains in and upon the following streets:

(1) A gas main in Woodland Avenue from Sunset Lane to Travis Heights Boulevard, the center line of which gas main shall be 5 feet north of and parallel to the center line of said Woodland Avenue. Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than 2½ feet.

The Texas Public Service Company is hereby put upon notice that the City of Austin does not guarantee that the space assigned above is clear from other underground utilities, but is based upon the best records we have at hand, and that the minimum depth stated does not have any reference to the fact that greater depths may be required at special points. When the Texas Public Service Company requires definite information upon the ground as to elevations or working points from which to base the location of their assignments, they shall apply to the City Engineering Department not less than three (3) days before such information is required. The Texas Public Service Company is further put upon notice that they will be required to bear the expense of repairs or replacement of any underground utility damaged during the construction of lines named in this resolution.

AND THAT wherever pavement is out in the vicinity of a fire plug, water must be used at intervals during the course of back-filling of the ditches.

That the work and laying of said gas mains, including the excavation in the streets and the restoration and maintenance of said streets after said mains have been laid, shall be under the supervision and direction of the City Manager, and under all the pertinent terms and conditions of the certain franchise granted to said Company by the City of Austin.

Reports of Southwest Bitulithic Company and H. R. F. Helland, Consulting Engineer, stating that the paving has been completed on East Fifteenth Street from the east line of Congress Avenue to Red River Street, District P-92, and on Twenty-ninth Street from the west line of Rio Grande Street to the east line of Salado Street, District P-95, in accordance with the plans and specifications, and recommending the acceptance of same, were read and ordered filed.

Reports of Southwest Bitulithic Company and H. R. F. Helland, Consulting Engineer, stating that the paving has been completed on Twenty-ninth Street from the east line

Of Salado Street to the east line of Shoal Crest, known as District No. P-96, was read and ordered filed.

The Mayor then laid before the Council the following resolutions:

FIFTEENTH STREET from the east property line of Congress Avenue to the west property line of Red River Street, known and designated as Unit or District No. P-92. and

WHEREAS, said contractor has fully completed the street improvements upon said unit or district of improvements above described in accordance with its contract and the plans and specifications made a part thereof, and said improvements have been found satisfactory and approved by the Consulting Engineer of the City, and have been found satisfactory and in accordance with the contract by the City Council of said City;

Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

I.

That the street improvements constructed by Southwest Bitulithic Company upon said portion of Fifteenth Street hereinbefore described be and the same are hereby in all things approved and accepted by the City of Austin.

II.

That any balance of the portion of the cost of said improvements agreed to be paid by the City of Austin be forthwith paid to said Contractor, and that the Mayor and City Clerk of said City of Austin be and they are hereby directed to execute and deliver to said Southwest Bitulithic Company assignable certificates of assessment against the various parcels of property abutting upon said portion of street and the owners of said property as heretofore provided by the ordinance levying assessments against said property and the owners thereof.

III.

That this resolution take effect at once.

RESOLUTION ACCEPTING STREET IMPROVEMENTS CONSTRUCTED BY SOUTHWEST BITULITHIC COMPANY ON A PORTION OF TWENTYNINTH STREET IN THE CITY OF AUSTIN, PROVIDING FOR A PAYMENT OF ANY BALANCE DUE BY THE CITY FOR ITS PORTION OF THE COSTS OF SAID IMPROVEMENTS AND FOR THE DELIVERY OF CERTIFICATES OF ASSESSMENTS AGAINST ABUTTING PROPERTY AND ITS OWNERS.

WHEREAS, on the 25th day of November, 1930, the City of Austin entered into a contract with Southwest Bitulithic Company whereby said company agreed to construct street improvements upon various portions of streets in the City of Austin, Texas,

among which portions of streets was the following, to-wit:

TWENTY-NINTH STREET from the west line of Rio Grande Street to the east line of Salado Street, known and designated as Unit or District No. P-95; and

TWENTY-NINTH STREET from the east line of Salado Street to the east line of Shoal Crest, known and designated as Unit or District No. P-96; and

WHEREAS, said contractor has fully completed the street improvements upon said units or districts of improvements above described in accordance with its contract and the plans and specifications made a part thereof and said improvements have been found satisfactory and approved by the Consulting Engineer of the City, and have been found satisfactory and in accordance with the contract by the City Council of said City;

Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

That the street improvements constructed by Southwest Bitulithic Company upon said portions of Twenty-ninth Street hereinbefore described be and the same are hereby in all things approved and accepted by the City of Austin.

Dear Sir:

Colorado Street from Fourteenth to Nineteenth Streets is under contract for paving at a forty foot width. Surveys of this street indicate that the width between present curbs varies from 36.6 feet to 40 feet. To make this street a uniform width of forty feet would necessitate the removal of approximately five blocks of curbing that is now in place.

I would recommend that the street be paved, using existing curbs as far as is practical and using the width of street that now exists.

STREET AND PORTIONS OF SUNDRY OTHER
STREETS IN THE CITY OF AUSTIN, TEXAS,
FIXING TIME AND PLACE FOR HEARING TO
THE OWNERS OF ABUTTING PROPERTY AND
DIRECTING THE CITY MANAGER TO GIVE
NOTICE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Austin has heretofore ordered that the hereinbelow mentioned portions of highways be improved by raising, grading and filling and installing concrete curbs and gutters, and by paving with two inch Warrenite Bitulithic Wearing Surface on a 5 inch concrete base, with necessary appurtenances, and contract therefor has been made and entered into with Southwest Bitulithic Company; and

WHEREAS, The City Council has caused the City Engineer to prepare and file estimates of the cost of such improvements, and estimate of the amounts per front foot proposed to be assessed against abutting property and the owners thereof, and such estimates have been examined.

Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

I.

That such estimates be and they are adopted and approved.

II.

That it is hereby found and determined that the cost of improvements on each such portion of highway, with the amount or amounts per front foot proposed to be assessed for such improvements against the abutting property and owners thereof, on each such portion of street or highway are as follows, to-wit:

BRAZOS STREET from the north line of the alley in Block 161 on the east side and the north property line of Thirteenth Street on the west side to the south property line of Nineteenth Street, known and designated as Unit or District No. P-123. Estimated cost of improvements is \$18,817.63. Estimated amount per front foot to be assessed for curb and gutter is \$0.65. Estimated amount per front foot to be assessed against abutting property and its owners for improvements exclusive of curb and gutter is \$4.118. Total estimated amount per front foot to be assessed against abutting property and its owner is \$4.768.

SAN ANTONIO STREET from the south property line of Ninth Street to the south property line of Eleventh Street, known and designated as Unit or District No. P-125. Estimated cost of improvements is \$8695.67. Estimated amount per front foot to be assessed for curb and gutter is \$0.65. Estimated amount per front foot to be assessed against abutting property and its owners for improvements exclusive of curb and gutter is \$4.507. Total estimated amount per front foot to be assessed against abutting property and its owners is \$5.257.

TWENTY-FIRST STREET from the west property line of Guadalupe Street to the east property line of Rio Grande Street, known and designated as Unit or District No. P-129. Estimated cost of improvements is \$7824.73. Estimated amount per front foot to be assessed for curb and gutter is \$0.65. Estimated amount per front foot to be assessed against abutting property and its owners for improvements, exclusive of curb and gutter is \$3.658. Total estimated amount per front foot to be assessed against abutting property and its owners is \$4.308.

TWENTY-SECOND STREET from the west property line of Guadalupe Street to the east property line of Rio Grande Street, known and designated as Unit or District No. P-130. Estimated amount per front foot to be assessed against abutting property and its owners for improvements exclusive of curb and gutter is \$3.561. Total estimated amount per front foot to be assessed against abutting property and its owners is \$4.211.

TWENTY-THIRD STREET from the west property line of Guadalupe Street to the east property line of Rio Grande Street, known and designated as Unit or District No. P-131.

Estimated cost of improvement is \$7736.57. Estimated amount per front foot to be assessed for curb and gutter is \$0.65. Estimated amount per front foot to be assessed against abutting property and its owners for improvements exclusive of curb and gutter is \$3.571. Total estimated amount per front foot to be assessed against abutting property and its owners is \$4.221.

NINTH STREET from the west property line of Guadalupe Street to the east property line of San Antonio Street, known and designated as Unit or District No. P-144, Estimated cost of improvements is \$2289.22. Estimated amount per front foot to be assessed for curb and gutter is \$0.65. Estimated amount per front foot to be assessed against abutting property and its owners for improvements exclusive of curb and gutter is \$3.534. Total estimated amount per front foot to be assessed against abutting property and its owners is \$4.184.

TENTH STREET from the west property line of Lavaca Street to the east property line of San Antonio Street, known and designated as Unit or District No. P-145. Estimated cost of improvements is \$5297.78. Estimated amount per front foot to be assessed for curb and gutter is \$0.65. Estimated amount per front foot to be assessed against abutting property and its owners for improvements exclusive of curb and gutter is \$.828. Total estimated amount per front foot to be assessed against abutting property and its owners is \$4.478.

III.

That a hearing be given and held by and before the City Council of the City of Austin, Texas, to all owning or claiming any property abutting upon any of said portions of streets and highways, as well as all owning or claiming any interest in any such property. Such hearing shall be given and held on the 30th day of April, 1931, at 10:30 o'clock A. M., in the regular Council meeting room in the City Hall in the City of Austin, Texas, and the City Manager is hereby directed to give notice of the time and place of such hearing, and of other matters and facts, in accordance with the terms and provisions of Article XXIV of the Charter of the City of Austin, which Article was added by amendment adopted at an election held on November 24th, 1928, Such notice shall be by advertisement inserted at least three times in a newspaper published in the City of Austin, Texas, the first publication to be made at least ten days before the date of said hearing. Said notice shall comply with and be in accordance with the terms and provisions of said Article XXIV.
