

SPECIAL MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL: Austin, Texas, August 17, 1918.

The Council met with all members present except Councilman Bartholomew.

Dr. Ellis's service car license

The application of Armstrong C. Ellis, 903 West Sixth street, for public service car license on his Overland car, No. 131679, was laid before the Council and granted by vote of 4 yeas, no nays.

The Mayor laid before the Council the following resolution:

RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN, TEXAS:

Transferred to pay meter Readers

That the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) be and the same is hereby transferred from the surplus funds in the Water and Light Department and appropriated to the additional pay of two meter readers in the Water and Light Department at the rate of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) per month each for the months of August, September, October, November and December.

The resolution was adopted by vote of 4 yeas, no nays.

The Mayor offered the following resolution:

RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN, TEXAS:

Transfers Dr. Dept.

That the sum of Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750.00) be and the same is hereby transferred from the Miscellaneous Fund of the General Street Department in the budget of the City of Austin for the year 1918 and credited to the account of "Fit Charges for Gravel."

The resolution was passed by vote of 4 yeas, no nays.

The Mayor laid before the Council the following resolution:

RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN, TEXAS:

Transfers Dr. Dept.

That the following stated balances in specially appropriated accounts of the General Street Fund of the budget of the City of Austin for the year 1918 be and the same are hereby transferred to the credit of the Miscellaneous Account in said General Street Fund, to-wit:

There was laid before the Council the following resolution:

RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN, TEXAS:

G. Flury Permit for sheds

That a permit be and the same is hereby granted to G. Flury to erect on his premises at the corner of Brazos and Second streets in this city, two open sheds, one 30 feet long by 14 feet wide, extending from a building now upon the grounds, as shown by the attached illustration, and another open shed 24 feet long by 14 feet wide by 14 feet high, as shown in the accompanying sketch.

These buildings are to be covered with sheet metal and a corrugated iron roof.

This application is endorsed by C. L. Woodward, Fire Chief, and E. L. Tallichet, Fire Marshal.

The resolution was passed by vote of 4 yeas, no nays.

APPROVED, August 17, 1918: A. P. Wooldridge, Mayor.

The Mayor offered the following resolution:

RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN, TEXAS:

That, as a matter of promotion to religious worship in this city, Thirty-ninth street between Avenue F and Speedway in Austin, Texas, be and the same is hereby closed to public vehicles from 8 o'clock P. M. to 10 o'clock P. M. for two weeks beginning August 18th, 1918.

This resolution is largely based upon the written consent of Messrs. M. M. Shipe & Son, Peter Mansbendel, and A. J. Sauter, who would be chiefly affected by the closing of the street heretofore described.

The written consent of the above named gentlemen is attached to this resolution and largely made the basis of the same.

The resolution was adopted by vote of 4 yeas, no nays.
