

SPECIAL MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL:

Austin, Texas, September 20, 1921.

The Council was called to order by the Mayor. Roll call showed the following members present: Mayor Yett, Councilmen Eyres, Haynes and Searight, 4; absent, Councilman Copeland.

Councilman Eyres moved that the bill of H. F. Kuehne, amounting to Seven Hundred Eighty-two Dollars and Seventy-nine Cents (\$782.79), the same being 3% fees on plans and specifications for the construction of a boiler house at the Water and Light Plant, be allowed and ordered paid. Motion prevailed by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor Yett, Councilmen Eyres, Haynes and Searight, 4; naves, none, Councilman Copeland absent.

L. M. LeMeilleur, representing the Hartford Steam Boiler Inspection and Insurance Company, appeared before the Council and made the proposition to insure the pump and turbine at the Water and Light Plant. Councilman Haynes moved that Councilman Eyres be authorized to take out such insurance as he deems advisable upon the pump and turbine at the Water and Light Plant. Motion prevailed by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor Yett, Councilmen Eyres, Haynes and Searight, 4; naves, none, Councilman Copeland absent.

REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL:

Austin, Texas, September 22, 1921.

The Council was called to order by the Mayor. Roll call showed the following members present: Mayor Yett, Councilmen Copeland, Eyres, Haynes and Searight, 5; absent, none.

Councilman Haynes moved that the regular order of business be suspended and that waiting committees be heard. Motion prevailed by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor Yett, Councilmen Copeland, Eyres, Haynes and Searight, 5; naves, none.

George W. Mendell, Attorney for W. E. Seekatz, appeared before the Council and complained of the drainage on the north side of West 31st Street, and upon motion of Councilman Haynes, the matter was referred to Councilman Searight by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor Yett, Councilmen Copeland, Eyres, Haynes and Searight; 5, naves, none.

Howard McKean, representing the A. T. McKean Estate, appeared before the Council and asked that the paving of West 13th Street between Colorado and Lavaca Streets be postponed for one year on account of the present business depression.

The above request was declined by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor Yett, Councilmen Copeland, Eyres, Haynes and Searight, 5; naves, none.
