Said sign is to be above the awning and within the curb line; it is to be two-faced, bull'seye, all steel, internally lighted, bearing the Words "Kelly Springfield Tires." The sign will measure four feet six inches vertically by eight feet three inches horizontally, and will be firmly anchored and guyed to a brick wall, all in conformity with the city's regulations and requirements.
