That as an assistance to the committee having in charge the Fifth Liberty Loan drive, and as a means of reminding the people of Austin of their duty to subscribe for these bonds, instructions are hereby given that at 10 A. M. and at 3 P. M. of each day until the end of the drive the whistle at the Water and Light Plant shall be blown seven times.
