The resolution was carried by the following vote: Yeas 5 - Mayor Yett, Councilmen Alford, Graham, Haynes and Ward.

The following resolution was introduced by Mayor Yett:

Whereas, the firemen employed by the City of Austin have no relief from continuous service in the way of relays; and

Whereas, it is the judgment of the City Council that a two weeks' vacation can safely be granted each and every fireman in the employ of the City in such manner and at such times as may be determined by the Chief of the Fire Department; and

Whereas, this vacation is well merited upon the part of those who have so faithfully served the City in the performance of every duty required of them,

Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN, TEXAS:

That this vacation be granted as applied for and in accordance with the laws governing same enacted by the Thirty-sixth Legislature.
