
SPECIAL MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL:

These appropriations are intended to be merely temporary and will be substituted by the appropriations of the General Budget, which will, presumably, be passed on or before the 20th day of January, 1920.


Councilman Granum introduced the following resolution;

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE WIDTH OF HOADWAY ON SEVENTH STREET BETWEEN BAYLOR AND BLANCO STREETS.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN, TEXAS:

That the width of the roadway between curbs on Seventh Street between Baylor and Blanco Streets be and the same is hereby established at 28 feet; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:



That the south curb line of the said Seventh Street shall be located at a distance of thirteen feet (13!) north of the existing south line of Seventh Street.

Councilman Alford moved that the regular order of business be suspended and that a committee, composed of J. A. Belger, A. C.Goeth and Leo Mueller, be heard. This committee presented petitions of the firemen and citizens of Austin, asking that the Council install a double platoon system in the Fire Department, to begin operation with the appropriations for the year

1920. After hearing the arguments favoring mame, Councilman Haynes moved that the petition be received, filed and taken under consideration. Motion carried by the following vote: Ayes, Eayor Yett, Councilmen Alford, Graham, Haynes and Ward, 5; nays, none.
