SPECIAL MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL:

AUSTIN, TEXAS, APRIL 10, 1920.

The Council was called to order by the Mayor. Roll call showed the following members present; Mayor Yett, Councilmen Alford, Haynes and Ward, 4; absent, Councilman Graham.

The application of Frank J. Comte, Agent for the Grey Burg Oil Company of San Antonio, Texas, for permission to erect a gasoline filling station at the intersection of Congress Avenue and First Street, on Lot 1, Block 5, was granted , with the understanding that same was to be erected under the supervision of the City Engineer and Chief of the Fire Department, by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor Yett, Councilmen Alford, Haynes and Ward, 4; nays, none, Councilman Graham absent.

The application of Frank J. Comte, Agent for the Grey Burg Oil Company of San Antonio, Texas, to erect a gasoline filling station at the intersection of Congress Avenue and East Sixteenth Street, on part of Lots 11 and 12, Outlot 48, Division "E", was granted, with the understanding that same was to be erected under the supervision of the City Engineer and Chief of the Fire Department, by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor Yett, Councilmen Alford, Haynes, and Ward, 4; nays , none, Councilman Graham absent.
