Now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN, TEXAS:

That the resolution passed on the 15th day of August, 1918, cancelling the permit to the said Sid Lock to drive said Public Service Cars Nos. 38 and 39 be reconsidered and revoked so far as Public Service Car No. 38 is concerned, and which Public Service Car No. 38 is hereby reinstated in its right to be operated as a public service car in this city under the terms of the original permit granted to the said Sid Lock, owner of same. It is, however, expressly stipulated that no additional permit or permits will be granted to the said Sid Lock to drive any additional public service car, over and above Public Service Car No. 38, during the balance of the calendar year 1918.

The resolution was adopted by a vote of 4 yeas, no nays;

Councilman Anthony not being present when the vote was taken.
