Councilman Haynes moved that the sewer charges against the Young Women's Christian Association, located at #908-607 Brazos Street, be dancelled and the same be placed on the free list on account of being a charitable institution. Motion prevailed by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor Yett, Councilmen Copeland, Eyres, Haynes and Searight, 5; nayes, none.

The application of B. F. Wright to install a gasoline tank at #1710 South Congress Avenue was read and upon motion of Councilman Eyres, same was granted, with the understanding that it should be erected under the supervision of the City Engineer, City Electrician and City Fire Marshal, by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor Yett, Councilmen Copeland, Eyres, Haynes and Searight, 5; nayes, none.
