

The Mayor introduced the following resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

That James Belger, A. W. Townsend, and Otto Ebeling be and they are hereby appointed and constituted a special commission, and each of said parties is appointed a special agent of the City of Austin for the purposes following:

It shall be the duty of said commission and said parties to make a survey of the real estate and improvements thereon situated within the city of Austin to determine the true valuations of said properties and to obtain all necessary data as to the valuations of same as now rendered, and to discover all property, both real and personal, now escaping taxation, and to collect and compile all necessary data thereof, for the use of the Board of Equalization during its sittings in the year 1921, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That each member of said special commission shall receive as compensation for his services the sum of \$5.00 per day for each day that he may actually work in said undertaking.

The above resolution was adopted by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor Yett, Councilmen Copeland, Eyres, Haynes and Searight, 5; nays, none.

The Council then recessed.

SPECIAL MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL:
