**BUDGET WORKSESSION - (CONTINUED)** 

Council continued its budget worksession. Mayor Cooksey asked how many dollars can be added to the revenue after careful scrutiny. Virginia Rutledge, Finance Director, said they have found revenues of \$626,165.00 which can be added into the budget from property tax, Southern Union Gas Company, CableVision and solicitation permits. Ms. Rutledge told Council that sales tax revenues are unstable and down 15% and are estimated to be down by \$400,000 for the fiscal year 1987-88.

Discussion continued and Councilmember Shipman asked how much money has been saved by closing the swimming pools one week early. She was told, by Mr. Jordan, Director of Parks and Recreaction Department, \$45,000.

Council adjourned its meeting at 6:05 p.m.
