WHEREAS, the City Council adopted a funding plan as part of the Fiscal Year 2003-2004 budget that allocated \$1.2 million from the Holly Good Neighbor Program to offset operations and maintenance costs relating to the Terrazas Library and Mexican American Cultural Center capital improvement projects; and

WHEREAS, the amount of funding needed to cover the operations and maintenance costs of these two projects is now estimated to be only \$770,000; and

WHEREAS, the Cepeda Music Garden and the Trail of Tejano Legends projects will serve as important additions to Austin's cultural landscape, especially since live music is such a critical component of our local culture; and

WHEREAS, providing financial support for these projects will help ensure that these two vital projects are realized; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

That the City Council allocates \$235,000 of the remaining funds in support of the Cepeda Music Garden Project and \$195,000 of the remaining funds in support of the Trail of Tejano Legends Project; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That the funds dedicated to the Trail of Tejano Legends Project will be allocated as follows:

- \$75,000 for constructing a statue of Roy Montelongo at the scenic overlook located near Canterbury and Pleasant Valley Road;
- \$25,000 for an art in public places project on Festival Beach Road to honor Nash Hernandez;
- \$35,000 for park improvements and a monument honoring Manuel and Robert Donley at the newly designated Manuel and Robert Donley Park;
- \$10,000 for developing permanent signs at the Fiesta Gardens Pavilion to denote that the pavilion has been named in honor of Johnny Degollado and for erecting a marker near the Southwest corner of Fiesta Gardens with biographical information about Johnny Degollado;
- \$25,000 for recognizing the contributions of the Perez and Ramos families at the grand plaza at the Mexican-American Cultural Center (MACC), which plaza is proposed to be named in their honor; and

, ,,	sign and construction of the Medina St. Plaza, be named for Roy and Matias Velasquez.
