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SUBJECT: Authorize execution of a Supplemental Amendment No.5 with TURNER COLLIE & BRADEN, INC., Austin, TX for site/archeological investigations and easement acquisition assistance for the Gilliland Creek Interceptor and extended construction phase services on the Northeast Wastewater Treatment Plant and the Wildhorse North Interceptor in the amount not to exceed \$62,900 for a total contract amount not to exceed \$3,214,532.

The Northeast Wastewater Treatment Plant (NEWWTP), the Wildhorse North Interceptor, and the Gilleland Creek Interceptor will serve wastewater customers in the northeast Austin area, a designated preferred growth area, including Wildhorse Ranch, the City of Manor, and Applied Materials and is the first phase in providing regional wastewater service to the Northeast area. This wastewater treatment plant is to be located within the Wild Horse Ranch development site. The construction of this wastewater treatment plant and the interceptors is in accordance with the Interlocal Agreement executed September 30, 2002, between the City of Austin and the City of Manor.


Specifically, this request is for authorization of additional funding for the following items:

- 1) Continuing easement procurement services for the Gilleland Creek Interceptor. Surveys have been completed for temporary construction easements and permanent Utility easements, field notes and sketches have been prepared for review by the City's Real Estate Services. Pending review of the easement documents and subsequent discussions with the current landowners and developers of the tracts some modification to the easement documents is anticipated. Additionally access to the work site is planned to be along the state highway 290 right of way, however, coordination with TX-DOT may result in the necessity to acquire a formal access easement.
- 2) An archeological survey/investigation in the area of both the temporary and permanent easements

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for the Gilleland Creek Interceptor is required by the Texas Historical Commission An archeological investigation report is to be prepared and submitted to the Texas Historical Commission for review and approval.

3) Additional construction phase services for the Wildhorse North Interceptor and the NEWWTP. The Wildhorse North Interceptor Project is being constructed by S.J. Louis Construction. At the present time, the Wildhorse North Interceptor is substantially complete and the remaining work in that contract includes reworking a manhole at the head end of the existing Manor WWTP to divert raw wastewater to the NEWWTP and the decommissioning of the Manor WWTP. The Northeast WWTP is being constructed by Pepper Lawson Construction. The current contract completion date is September 21, 2005. Various issues have caused the construction time period to lengthen; hence the original construction phase services budget has been consumed. The extremely wet weather during the 2004 calendar year has had the most severe impact to the overall schedule. The plant is constructed, but the performance testing phase is not yet complete. The performance acceptance testing is anticipated to take approximately 40 days. Following the completion of the performance acceptance testing and the correction of deficiencies, the wastewater flow will be diverted away from the Manor WWTP and the Manor WWTP can be decommissioned.

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
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
