The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) will be making improvements to State Highway 290 (SH 290) in Oak Hill in the near future. The improvements will necessitate removal of the existing Southwest C pump station on SH 290. The existing pump station at West Slaughter Lane and FM 1826 will be expanded to replace the Southwest C pump station.

This amendment provides funding for Construction Phase Services to perform inspection of construction for an extended period made necessary by valve delivery delays by the manufacturer and an additional three weeks if needed.

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
