Background

The Council on At-Risk Youth (CARY) was organized to reduce the number of physical and/or verbal violence incidents among program participants who are already in the school disciplinary system. The objectives include implementation of a 12-month program including (1) violence prevention skills training, (2) individual counseling, and (3) service learning projects for students referred by school authorities.

Program Description

Youth served will include middle school students enrolled at the Alternative Learning Center, Bedichek, Dobie and Webb Middle Schools who have been referred to the school disciplinary system and then to CARY. Also, students who are typically behind academically, and have behavioral management problems and come from families characterized as dysfunctional with poverty, drug and alcohol abuse, and who may have incarcerated family members.

The target population includes 11- through 15-year-old male and female middle school students who have been assigned to in-school or out-of-school suspension, or placed in disciplinary detention, or selected by principals as needing intervention, or removed from class and assigned to the disciplinary Alternative

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Learning Center. Behaviors that are common to the target population include assault, abuse, aggression, insubordination, bullying, sexual harassment, intimidation of others, destruction of school property, sale of dangerous drugs, and/or possession of weapons.
