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Purchasing Service Agreement RECOMMENDATION FOR COUNCIL ACTION

TEM NO: 24

Subject: Authorize execution of a nine-month service agreement with PDS TECHNICAL SERVICES, Austin, TX, for the provision of a temporary serologist and a temporary evidence technician for the Austin Police Department in an amount not to exceed \$67,080, with two 12-month extension options in an amount not to exceed \$89,440 per extension option, for a total agreement amount not to exceed \$245,960.

Amount and Source of Funding: Funding in the amount of \$67,080 is available in the Fiscal Year 2005-2006 Police Department Approved Operating Budget Special Revenue Fund: U. S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Program, Forensic Casework DNA Backlog Reduction Program. Funding for the extension options is contingent upon available funding in future budgets.

Fiscal Note: There is no unanticipated fiscal impact. A fiscal note is not required.

PDS Technical Services, a temporary employment agency, will provide a qualified Serology Screener and Evidence Technician to assist the Austin Police Department DNA Lab in reducing the backlog of DNA cases. The Serology Screener will perform initial processing of evidence, including documenting the Items, performing presumptive testing, and collecting stains and packaging them for storage and tracking until DNA testing begins. The Evidence Technician will coordinate the transfer of DNA evidence from the cold case/sex crimes investigator to the DNA Lab, including logging the evidence, insuring the Integrity of chain of custody, and notifying the forensic scientist when evidence is available.
