This Council action authorizes negotiation and execution of an Interlocal Agreement between the University of Texas at Austin (University) and the Austin Police Department (APD). APD has utilized the services of the University for the past seven years. The University provides professional consultant services and assists the City in training its police department personnel in community policing and leadership skills. The University will specifically assist in development and delivery of training for each cadet class in leadership, juvenile crime, and familiarization with the university community. Additionally, the University will evaluate Police Training Academy curriculum, develop approaches to increase cadet candidates, coordinate University student volunteers on community policing projects, and assist with research related to community policing projects.

This agreement is entered into under the provisions of the Interlocal Cooperation Act, Chapter 791, Texas Government Code.
