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Austin Water Utility RECOMMENDATION FOR COUNCIL ACTION

ITEM No. 5

Subject: Authorize the City Manager to negotiate and execute an amendment with the City of Rollingwood to the "Agreement for Wholesale Wastewater Service Between the City of Rollingwood, Texas and the City of Austin, Texas" to allow the use of the City of Austin's winter month average billing methodology for certain property in the City of Rollingwood.

Amount and Source of Funding: No City funds are required by this action.

Prior Council Action: Wastewater agreement and three amendments to the agreement: 1/14/1999, 8/3/2000, 11/20/2003, 11/18/2004

On January 27, 1999, the City of Rollingwood ("Rollingwood") and the City of Austin ("Austin") entered into a wholesale wastewater agreement for a peak wet weather service level of 300 gpm. Wholesale wastewater service to Rollingwood commenced on March 8, 2002. Currently, Rollingwood has 507 residential connections and 23 commercial connections receiving wholesale wastewater service from Austin. Of the total number of connections, seven properties are billed using a winter month average because their wastewater flows do not flow through Rollingwood's lift station and wastewater meter, but have direct connections to Austin's wastewater system.

After further engineering analysis and discussion, Rollingwood and Austin representatives agreed to allow one single family resident's property located entirely in Rollingwood (5100 Rollingwood Drive which is not part of the above mentioned seven properties) to receive wastewater service through a connection to the City of West Lake Hills' ("West Lake Hills") wastewater system. West Lake Hills has agreed to allow this wastewater flow to pass-through its wastewater system to Austin's wastewater system. Rollingwood will be billed for wholesale wastewater service for the single family resident's property using Austin's winter month average methodology. The amendment to the wholesale agreement would not increase the maximum wastewater service level for either Rollingwood or West Lake Hills, and the amendment would not modify the service area for either Rollingwood or West Lake Hills.
