
Brushy Creek consists of approximately 725 acres entirely located outside the City's Extraterritorial Jurisdiction and within the City of Round Rock's Extraterritorial Jurisdiction. Brushy Creek is generally located north of RM 620, east of Parmer Road, west of Wyoming Springs, and south of FM 1431. Brushy Creek owns and operates its own water and wastewater treatment plants and the City of Austin does not provide it wholesale water and wastewater service. Brushy Creek currently serves approximately 5,200 connections within Brushy Creek.


A developer requested that Brushy Creek provide out-of-district water service to the 10 acre "Warren Tract," located adjacent to Brushy Creek's eastern boundary, but within the City of Austin's service area Brushy Creek water and wastewater infrastructure is located adjacent to the tract. The nearest City of Austin water and wastewater mains are located approximately seven miles away. The Warren Tract is projected to contain commercial development. A map of the area is attached

Major points of the agreement include

•Landowner will request annexation by the City of Austin •Water and wastewater capital recovery fees will be collected and held in escrow until the City of Austin provides retail water and wastewater service •Infrastructure within the Warren Tract will be built to City of Austin standards by the Developer •Construction plans will be reviewed and approved by the City of Austin and Brushy Creek •Developer will pay City of Austin inspection fees
