**Boards and Commission Action** Recommended by the Water and Wastewater Commission

Due to a number of key factors, including age, condition, and loss of function, the Green Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is scheduled for decommissioning and demolition by November 2008. Recently completed improvements at the Ullrich WTP provide sufficient water treatment capacity to allow for the decommissioning of the 82-year old Green WTP. A remaining factor in the timing of the decommissioning of the Green WTP is the completion of a 72-inch water transmission main relocation project located in the vicinity of the nearby Seaholm Power Plant site redevelopment project. It is anticipated that the relocation of the 72-inch main will be completed by Spring 2007. The main is critical to meet demands during the late spring and summer months. Project scheduling will take into account completion of this relocation project.

This project will be executed in phases. The first phase will be planning and preliminary engineering, the second phase will be design and bidding of decommissioning, demolition, and related construction, and the third phase will be for the decommissioning, demolition, and construction

The project will result in the development of a site and facilities decommissioning and demolition plan (Plan), in compliance with all applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations. The Plan's scope will include identification of all facets necessary to completely deconstruct the facilities, specifically those identified for deconstruction in the course of the planning and preliminary engineering phase, including removal from the property, backfilling and compacting the excavated areas with appropriate material, and erosion control, as required. The Plan will also include preliminary engineering for the construction of utility connections and relocations necessitated by the plant's decommissioning and demolition. Intake planning and Shoal Creek bank stabilization are included as well. Anticipated planning/preliminary engineering phase

task elements include site evaluation and plan development permitting plan, cost estimates, and other items

This authorization provides for funding of services related to planning and preliminary engineering services only. Staff anticipates returning to Council for additional funding to the selected firm for design, bid and construction phase services. The estimated project costs for these additional services will be determined in the planning and preliminary engineering phase of the project.

This request allows for the development of a professional services agreement with the recommended firm Should the City be unsuccessful in negotiating a satisfactory agreement with the recommended firm, negotiations will cease with that firm. Staff will then return to Council and request authorization to begin negotiations with the alternate recommendation listed on the attachment.



Participation subgoals stated in the solicitation were 1.7% African American, 9.5% Hispanic, 4.7% Asian American, 0.6% Native American and 14.2% WBE. The recommended firm provided MBE/WBE Compliance Plans that met the goals of the solicitation and was approved by the Department of Small and Minority Business Resources. The alternate firm provided an M/WBE Compliance Plan that met the goals of the solicitation and was approved by the Department of Small and Minority Business Resources.

Notification of issuance of a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for the subject services was sent to 248 firms on May 11, 2006. The RFQ was obtained by 30 firms, and six firms submitted qualification statements. None of the firms were certified M/WBE firms. Of the six firms evaluated, two firms were short-listed and interviewed. Interviewing the short-listed firms resulted in the following recommendation.
