SUBJECT: Watershed Protection Department Summer Internship Program Overview

This memo is meant to provide you with an overview of the Watershed Protection Department's summer internship program. Now in its fifth year, this program has proved mutually beneficial to college students preparing to enter the workforce, our staff and the department as a whole.

Summer interns have been very helpful during their 12 to 15 week assignments. Introduced to a professional work environment, they assist in developing solutions to real world problems and take on a wide range of projects from youth education and water quality monitoring to civil engineering and geospatial analysis. In addition to their office tasks, the interns take part in outside activities such as water quality monitoring, surveying opportunities for Austin's children to connect with nature, helping at public meetings and constructing rain gardens at elementary schools.

The program has become a way for the City to recruit a diverse group of new employees. Since the program's inception, 56 interns have participated from 15 different universities. The City currently employs seven of these interns. But whether the interns go on to work for the City or the private sector, the program educates them on important City goals such as the importance of protecting lives, property and the environment from flooding, erosion and water pollution.

The program was designed with the following goals:

- Recruit applicants with diverse backgrounds and disciplines to mirror our community while ensuring the most qualified candidates are hired.
- Have a well-defined plan for providing opportunities for students to learn, develop and actively do meaningful work that advances the goals of the department.
- Provide cross training and exposure to different jobs for students who may be unsure of their career plans.
- Build long-term relationships with the faculty and staff of universities and colleges.

The program includes disciplines such as engineering, natural sciences, accounting, communications and geographic information systems (GIS). Each intern is assigned a mentor, attends a one-day training and receives information about the department. At the end of their internship, the interns receive a booklet called, "Reflections," which has profiles of each intern, including their favorite experiences from the program. With photos and text, this booklet is an excellent commemoration of their internship with WPD. I've attached a copy for your information.
