SUBJECT: Wildland-Urban Interface Code Implementation

The City of Austin adopted the Austin/Travis County Community Wildfire Protection Plan (CWPP) in 2014. The CWPP focuses on creating and ensuring resilient landscapes, fire adapted communities, and effective response to wildfire. Additionally, the CWPP recommends adopting and enforcing local building code that requires fire-resistant home design and materials.

The proposed 2015 International Wildland-Urban Interface (WUI) Code ordinance amendment is CWPP compliant. It proposes the consolidation of relevant WUI Code provisions into one section for efficiency. Specific requirements that improve overall fire prevention and safety in the community are also included in the amendment. During initial one-on-one meetings with Mayor and Council, Austin Fire Department (AFD) provided the detailed table below illustrating the primary sections within the WUI Code that have been amended and highlighted elements of the WUI Code which exist in currently adopted city codes.

Funding for implementation of the WUI Code focuses on the requirement that new construction and exterior remodels/additions built within identified WUI areas will be reviewed and inspected. Permit fees will be determined by time and complexity of each project.

The revenue projection is dependent upon development patterns and site locations. As with any forecast, the number of reviews and resulting revenue may vary. The estimated 300-400 reviews and inspections per month would produce revenue consistent with other AFD permit fees.

In order to implement the WUI Code, one-time costs for equipment and vehicles are estimated at \$438,000 and annual on-going personnel costs are estimated at \$1.5M. Staffing currently includes: four (4) plans reviewers, two (2) administrative assistants, one (1) Fire Captain, and four (4) Fire Lieutenants. Future workload may necessitate adding positions if supported by revenue collected.

AFD is exploring a phased approach to stagger initial start-up costs in order to begin training civilian personnel prior to the implementation of fees.
