	The shelter will advise me about <i>known</i> behavioral or medical issues that a pet has shown, but <i>cannot</i> guarantee the medical or behavioral health of a adopted pet
	Although this shelter records behavior information on pets while they are the shelter, the shelter <i>cannot</i> predict future behavior, and cannot test for possible triggers for aggression or other behavior problems.
	The shelter does not know the medical, vaccination, or genetic history of animals. A pet may have been exposed to disease or have genetic proble that the shelter is unable to detect. A pet adopted here <i>may or may not</i> h been seen by one of our veterinarians.
	n willing to accept certain risks that come hadopting a pet from a shelter:
	The shelter will not adopt a pet to be a surprise gift for someone else. To give a pet as a gift, the shelter offers Gift Certificates, which allow the recipient to adopt <i>when</i> and <i>what</i> will work best for them!
	I will need to take my new pet to my own veterinarian within 10 days of adoption (within 5 days if he/she has just had surgery) for a full evaluation and to arrange for continued protection from parasites and disease.
	The shelter will not adopt a pet under 6 months old to anyone planning to keep him/her outside day and night.
	All pets adopted from the shelter will be sterilized (spayed or neutered) to prevent overpopulation and to protect the pet's health. If I select a pet that can't be altered at the shelter, I will pay a deposit and then have the pet altered at my own veterinarian at my expense by an agreed-upon date.
	I will pay an adoption fee for any pet(s) adopted and I will be responsible for <i>all</i> costs related to the pet after adoption.
	The shelter will make the final decision about whether a certain animal is available for adoption.

The shelter and my neighbors expect, and I agree that...

- 1. I will provide everything my new pet needs throughout his or her life (large dogs live an average of 8 12 years, small dogs and cats generally live longer, up to 20 years!), including fresh water, nutritious food, companionship, proper shelter, exercise and play each day, plus heartworm, flea and tick prevention, and regular veterinary care.
- 2. I will make sure my pet is always wearing current, accurate, visible identification (a collar & tags).
- 3. I will keep my *dog* safe on a leash, inside my home, or in a securely fenced yard. I will keep my *cat* (over 6 months old) safely indoors for at least the first 3 weeks in my home so he/she has time to become familiar with me and accustomed to my home.
- 4. I will abide by all state and local laws regarding pets where I live, including requirements for rabies vaccinations and pet registration or licensing, as well as any "leash laws," or tethering, shelter or noise-prevention rules.
- 5. I will be responsible for risks and liabilities associated with my new pet--including bites, fights, or damage caused by the animal.
- 6. I will provide a safe, *indoor* environment for my puppy or kitten (under 6 months of age) so that he or she is protected from harm and learns good social skills.
- 7. I will help my *dog* to be a good citizen by providing humane training and by always picking up any "messes" he or she leaves behind. If I allow my adult *cat* outdoors, I will make sure my cat is a good neighbor by providing a clean litter box so that he/she is not forced to use neighborhood flower beds or yards as a toilet.
- 8. I will protect my pet when traveling by always using a safely secured crate, cage, or safety harness; and by never leaving him or her in a parked car when it is over 65 degrees outside.
- 9. I will take my pet to a licensed veterinarian within 10 days of adoption (within 5 days if the pet has just had surgery), and at least once each year after that for check-ups and vaccinations.
- 10. I will bring the pet back to the shelter if I can't keep him or her, or find a responsible, caring new home and **provide the shelter with the new owners' contact information** so we can continue to help protect the pet.
